# Program Information by Bette Stubbs

#### **Monthly Doings**

Do you know how to print pictures of your family onto fabric using your jet printer? Do you know how to incorporate these photos into quilts for weddings and other family occasions? In **March Joyce Noell** will demonstrate the various ways of printing pictures onto fabric. She also plans to show us her own photo printing techniques on her quilts. Don't miss this very informative program.

In **April** international quilting teacher and author of several quilting and applique books, **Mimi Dietrich**, will present a trunk show of her award winning Baltimore Album quilts. She is one of the founding mothers of the Baltimore Applique Society. This lecture features a variety of appliquéd quilts, including floral wreaths, baskets, bouquets, quilts inspired by antique appliquéd quilts and contemporary Baltimore Album quilts. Mimi will also share secrets for making group applique quilts. She will bring the quilts from her book *Baltimore Bouquets*.

Mimi will be giving a **day-long Baltimore Applique workshop** at Trinity Church on Monday, April 23. During this workshop learn fun applique techniques for a variety of dimensional flowers using a 10 inch pattern from Mimi's book *Baltimore Bouquets*. Techniques include thin stems, pinched leaves, folded rosebuds, gathered buds, gathered blossoms, roses and bluebells. Some knowledge of applique is helpful but Mimi is a delightful and patient teacher who inspires everyone. The workshop will be \$45.00 to members and \$55.00 to non-members. Signup begins at the January meeting and is limited to 20 students. The class list and photo are available on <a href="http://www.mimidietrich.com">http://www.mimidietrich.com</a> under Baltimore Bouquet workshop.

Mimi will also teach a **half-day Beginner's Applique Workshop** Tuesday morning, April 24, from 9:00 am to noon. Participants will learn to do a little heart, circle, stems and leaves. A kit will be provided for this session. Please bring: applique needles, thimble, paper scissors, small sharp scissors that cut to the point, straight pins (1/2" or 3/4" applique pins recommended), fabric marker that will show on background fabric (silver pencil recommended), 12" square of freezer paper, tape (Scotch Removable Magic tape recommended), glue stick, and small tweezers. Registration fee is \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members.



It's going to be a lot of fun.

We all want to see what you've been doing, so won't you please get together some of your projects to display at our celebration? We've planned a big "show and share" segment for the event.

Send in your registration forms. They're available at the meeting in February and at <a href="http://www.lakequilters.org">http://www.lakequilters.org</a>. It only cost \$20 and includes lunch. We will have lots of door prizes and favors (Alba Papa and Sue Dixon and their committee members have really been working hard on them), and there will be vendors there with the latest quilting stuff. The deadline for registration is March 10.

#### **CHARITY PROJECTS**

#### February is our LQG annual charity quilt-in day...time for "Sharing the Love of Quilting"!

I hope you are looking forward to sewing for charity as much as we are. It's a great feeling to be doing something <a href="special">special</a> for someone...a child needing something to hug...showing a critical-care patient that someone cares. That's why <a href="all">all</a> of our work is so important. Sometimes there is very little you or I can do for someone, but making bears and quilts is something we <a href="can do">can do</a>. And our supply of bears and quilts is depleted after the Christmas holidays!

Please come and sew bears and/or quilts...or stuff bears...and have a good time too. Thanks to Geri Grindle, we'll have lots of stuffing for our bears. And thanks to a couple of our Bees, we'll have some bears ready to stuff and some fabric pre-cut and ready to sew for rail fence quilt tops and checkerboard quilt tops. We'll also have a couple of quilt tops with batting and backing that will be in need of some machine quilting...if anyone is interested!

Following is a list of the major projects we will need people to do:

- -sew around bears that have already been cut out
- -stuff bears that have been sewn before the quilt-in
- -hand sew up the backs of the bears after they're stuffed
- -machine sew across the bears arms, legs and ears so they're easily movable
- -clip the outside edges of the bears
- -tie ribbons around the necks of the finished bears
- -sew pre-cut fabric into rail fence or checkerboard quilt tops ..and
- -machine quilt already pieced quilt tops

Think about what you'd like to work on and bring the supplies you'll need to do that project. Things you may want to bring:

- -sewing machines and sewing supplies plus extra bobbins and colored thread
- -knitting needles, crochet hooks, chop sticks or instruments for stuffing bears
- -your favorite sewing needle to hand sew bears after they're stuffed

#### FEATURED QUILTER OF THE MONTH



Madeline Demchak

Hi, my name is Madeline Demchak. I moved here from Levittown, Long Island about eight and a half years ago after retiring with my husband Al to Boones Mill.

Not knowing anyone, I had joined several different clubs both at the Lake and in Roanoke-mostly dealing with day trips, plays and handcrafts (such as quilting, knitting, crocheting and cross-stitching).

I only got involved with quilting about six and a half years ago. I was a little reluctant to join because I "hated sewing". My best friend encouraged me to go and I've been hooked ever since.

I've met many friends through the guild and quilting has become one of my favorite passions.

I didn't think I'd find many finished items in my stash since I've given quite a few away. But in my search I found some of my first quilts and others I've done along the way and even worked on finishing some in these past few weeks.

#### Ouilt in a Year 2007

This year's project is titled "Celebrating the 400th Anniversary of Jamestown and our State of Virginia." We are leaving the fabric color and print choice up to each quilter. We do suggest that you pick a focus fabric and color before you begin to unify the various blocks. Also, consider using reproduction fabrics to achieve an aged look, but again, it's your choice.

We will be teaching 10 blocks...you may do all of them and have a bed sized quilt or some of them and have a wall hanging. Sandra Ferguson will be teaching this month's block, the Virginia Reel. Each teacher is making two blocks, one to keep and one to donate for a raffle quilt to benefit our guild. Please keep in mind that we do have our Guild Quilt show in 2008, and it is hoped that many of these projects will be on display. Keep up with your blocks!

We will meet at noon, prior to the regular monthly guild meetings, in one of the classrooms. (Note: Smith Mountain Lake Quilting has several copies available of the book we are using as reference, *Quilts of Virginia* 1607-1899, if you'd like to purchase one.)
