Monthly Doings

In today's meeting **Joyce Noell** will demonstrate various techniques designed to help you print photographs on your computer's printer. These photographs can then be put into quilts. Joyce will also bring along some of her quilts in which she has incorporated family photographs.

APRIL

International Baltimore Album applique teacher/lecturer/author **Mimi Dietrich** will present her award-winning Baltimore Album quilts during our April meeting. She will also have copies of her newest book BALTIMORE BASICS. She has a few copies of her out of print book BALTIMORE BOUQUETS if someone is interested.

MIMI DIETRICH WORKSHOPS

April 23, Monday, is an **all-day** Baltimore Album workshop beginning at 9 a.m. at Trinity Ecumenical. There will be a lunch break and we will continue working after lunch until somewhere around 3 p.m. Bring your lunch if you wish. There is one opening left in this workshop and no waiting list at this time. The supply list is available on Mimi's site http://www.mimidietrich.com and also available at signup. Cost for the all-day workshop is \$45 to members and \$55 to non-members.

April 24 is a **half-day** beginner's workshop for \$25 to members and \$35 to non-members. Mimi will bring fabric and cut out freezer paper for students to make a small block and learn to applique a heart, a stem, a leaf and a circle similar to the project on the website. There is **NO** cost to students for the kit but they **do need** to bring the following:

thimble, small sharp scissors that cut to the point, straight pins (1/2" or 3/4" applique pins recommended), sharp

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop.



pencil or mechanical pencil, glue stick, tweezers to pull out freezer paper, and white thread for basting. You do not need a fabric marker since your pattern will be marked. Mimi will have thread and needles. She does sell an Easy Applique Samplers book with an expanded pattern in it.

Representatives from **Creative Stitches** in Lynchburg will be on hand to discuss sewing machine maintenance, needles and stabilizers. Handouts will also be available. Creative Stitches runs the "buy one package of Schmetz needles and get the second package free" ads in our newsletter. If you wish to bring your coupons and let one of the program chairs know if you want a particular Schmetz needle, they can have them at the meeting for you. Ouilt in a Year 2007

This year's project is titled "Celebrating the 400th Anniversary of Jamestown and our State of Virginia." We are leaving the fabric color and print choice up to each quilter. We do suggest that you pick a focus fabric and color before you begin to unify the various blocks. Also, consider using reproduction fabrics to achieve an aged look, but again, it's your choice.

We will be teaching 10 blocks...you may do all of them and have a bed sized quilt or some of them and have a wall hanging. Jan Hagen and Dottie Wilson will be teaching this month's block, Virginia Worm Fence (aka Split Rail Fence). Each teacher is making two blocks, one to keep and one to donate for a raffle quilt to benefit our guild. Please keep in mind that we do have our Guild Quilt show in 2008, and it is hoped that many of these projects will be on display. Keep up with your blocks!

In April, please bring your fabric (15" square) for the redwork block. If you will not be at the meeting, bring it in March or May. I will have a pattern to iron on, and hopefully, a sample of what it will look like. As always, we will meet at noon, prior to the regular monthly guild meetings, in one of the classrooms.


