October

Today's program features **Melissa Hizy** who will speak about wool applique. Melissa will teach us a small hands-on project that she calls crazy patch applique on wool. Be sure to get your handout of the basic stitches involved. With the holidays approaching, many of you will want to start wool/felted wool projects to give as gifts. Please see last month's newsletter for your basic sewing items to take to the meeting (scissors, needles, pins, embroidery floss, etc.). Melissa will have a kit for you to try wool applique.

November

This is also a great opportunity for you to introduce a new technique that you have discovered, a new pattern or an interesting tool. Let's see all of your great work!

at a time, beating well between each addition. Stir in vanilla and nuts. The dough will be stiff. Spread in pan. Place in oven. Bake at 300 degrees for 45 minutes. Turn oven off and leave another 15 minutes with the door closed. Remove and invert the pan on a large, flat rock. Peel off the paper. Let cool for an hour and then cut in very small pieces. Pack in a tin and hide. Every day you can enjoy a nice treat. Recipe makes at least 90 wonderfully rich brownies.

I haven't even started on my "outside the box" challenge quilt that has to be done in December yet! Well—you'd better get busy! October is pretty much gone and November looms. No more nice frozen salads or drinks for you, but I have included my very finest brownie recipe that once you make it, you will use it only for the "best" occasions. These keep well if you hide them. Yes, they are a little more involved than opening a boxed mix, but just like a nice quilt—the end result is worth the effort. Happy Quilting!!

Seguoia Brownies

1/2 lb. butter 4 squares unsweetened chocolate

1 cup flour 1/2 tsp. salt

1 tsp. vanilla 2 cups chopped nuts (walnuts are healthy)

4 eggs 2 lbs. brown sugar

DO NOT PREHEAT THE OVEN! Line a one-inch deep jelly roll pan with wax paper or parchment and spray with Baker's Joy or a flour-based product. Melt butter and chocolate over a double boiler and add sugar. (I know you have not used a double boiler in years but this recipe is worth the effort.) Stir around until well mixed and warm. Remove from heat. Stir in flour and salt. Add the eggs, one


