



April—a glorious month. Everyday the view from the quilting room has changed from those little crocus that

were squeezing through the thawing ground to those tall, proud daffodils and jonquils. The redbud trees are squeezing out blooms and the dogwoods are puffed and ready to break out. The banks and side yards display the little blooms of periwinkle and the forsythia displays are beautiful. The Quilt Rally is over and laundry baskets of freshly washed fabrics await the warmth of the iron. Decisions, decisions. Do we head to the flower bed or to the ironing board? Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher.

Registration: Registration will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Sign-ups will not be accepted prior to this time. Registration is complete once you have signed-up AND paid. You must be registered to attend a workshop.

<u>Waiting List</u>: Once a workshop is filled, a waiting list will be established. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be contacted. *Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.*

July 22nd (1:00 pm) Program and Workshop (9:00 am to Noon)

Linda Fiedler who was originally scheduled to be with us in March has rescheduled her workshop and program for July 22. Linda is a prize-winning quilt maker, teacher (local, regional and national), author and judge whose quilts have won awards at many of the large national and international shows. She is among the prestigious perennial winners at the Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival. Through the years Linda has become less traditional, but still creates designs based on traditional patterns. Inspired by colors from the natural world, she loves studying the never-ending interactions of different color combinations



that quilting provides. Linda will teach her "Crazy Log Cabin" technique during her morning workshop (9am-Noon). Please remember to register if you would like your name added to the waiting list.

Linda will also present our afternoon program (1:00 pm). She will share information about her trip to Switzerland. Her factory tours included Bernina and Mettler. She also experienced a virtual tour of a needle factory. This will be a great opportunity to hear a quilter's perspective.



August 26th (1:00 pm) Program and Workshop (9:00 am to Noon)

Gayle P. Ropp will be here in August. Gayle's work has appeared in many books and magazines. She has been a staff member of the Jinny Beyer Hilton Head Seminar since 1990. (Check www.tisquickquilter.com for more information about Gayle.) She will provide a 3 hour workshop, "Final Touches" (9 am-Noon). The guilt is guilted! Let the binding begin! Join Gayle to learn more about different types of binding, miters, curves, and prairie points. Sleeves for hanging and labels will also be covered. This class is for all levels. Thus 36 winners instead of three will be announced at our meeting on Tuesday, April 22nd. Prizes will also be awarded at that time. We had a tremendous turn out of volunteers that helped in some capacity during the planning or on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. We will have drawings for prizes for those helpful folks on Tuesday also. The final report on the guilt show will be in the Quilt Show Notebook, in the library. It will include a financial statement and a list of all the viewer's choice winners, among other things. In addition, we have made some suggestions for the 2010 show. CHARITY BEE NEWS

It was really great to see so many finished projects come in at our last meeting. In March, we collected 30 toiletry bags, 50 wheelchair bags, 33 Christmas stockings, 8 bears (in addition to the 120-plus we finished in February), 30 pillow pals, and 28 lap quilts.

On Wednesday, April 9th, Marsha Wright and Katherine Lewis traveled to Bedford to distribute charity items. They were well received by everyone, and distributed the following:

The response to the pillow pals has been wonderful. Some of you have complained that they are hard to sew together. Probably that is because you have stuffed the arms and legs too full. Make them soft, and just in the ends. Be sure to stitch them in place on the front before trying to sew the whole thing together. Also, make sure you clip the loops of yarn that make the hair. Safety issue.

Please keep on finishing projects. There are still a lot of kits out there. Some people picked up new kits at the last meeting. Sandy Kelso is keeping track of who has what, and will be bugging you if you don't get your finished projects in. We can always use new lap quilts. Remember, charity projects are the responsibility of every member, since we all are members of the charity bee. Thanks for all you do, and remember when you bring something in finished, you can put your name in the special charity drawing for a prize.

Thanks for all you have done. We still have 20 bears and a few mittens and caps that we're saving until fall. Most places have enough to last a few months now. Next time we have a delivery day, think about going along. It's a very rewarding experience, and really doesn't take a lot of time. The Rocky Mount group only took 1 1/2 hours to deliver all that stuff, and the Bedford gals went out to lunch and shopped for a while as well. What fun! And what a great service to the community.

LQG Annual Quilt Retreat

The Retreat is all set for November 7.8.9, 2008 at the Howard Johnson Motel in Lexington, VA. "Stitchin" will commence about 3:00 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 7, and will end about Noon on Sunday, Nov. 9. Cost will be \$125 for the entire weekend again this year. Meals will be on your own; continental breakfast will be available at the motel.

I will be at the April 22 meeting with sign-up forms. (In addition, forms are being emailed with your newsletter.) A deposit of \$35 will be required with the sign-up. Balance of \$90 will be due by September 23 (Sept. Quilt Guild Meeting). We are limited to 30 people so plan on having your deposit and getting signed up right away. If you have a preference for roommate, please be sure to discuss it with her and put it on your sign-up form.

Copyright laws and the Quilter

There is often a lot of confusion over copyright laws as they apply to quilting and crafting. Here we hope to explain some of the "cans" and "cannots" that you need to bear in mind while working with commercial patterns and products. We'll begin this month with some of the "cans."

When you can copy:

- Making a copy is part of the "intended use": you buy a quilt pattern which consists of a typed booklet and templates. It is expected that you will trace the templates and reproduce the quilt design in fabric.
- To quote a new book in a review you write for your guild newsletter: you can quote parts of a book or pattern (including pictures) that are only a small section of the whole, for purposes of a review, research article, news story, etc.
- When you want to have a copy to take to class while the good one stays home: you can copy the relevant pages from your quilting book to take to class so you don't loose the book you purchased.
- Replacing lost or damaged items: your cat gets into the sewing room while you're at work and shreds the tissue for the paper piecing blocks you're working on. It's okay to copy the missing portions of the pattern from the copy your friend has.
- When the author includes permission: you have my permission to copy this article for your guild newsletters or class handouts. You must always include the author's name and copyright notice along with anything you reprint.

QUILT in a YEAR 2008


We should have the Jan, Feb and March blocks up on the web site by now, and if not, they will be.

I used the "Cindy Clark" method of doing the blossoms for the March mountain laurel, and not having any fancy material, used a well worn handkerchief from my husband's stash...loved the look, so realistic (made yoyos but did not turn the ends in, left them "fluffy", made 4 spaced stitches around the circle to give it a five petal look, added a few gold French knots, and finally a few

dots with a rusty colored permanent marker...lovely. I did the rest of the block with Sandra's technique, easy way to get the curved twig look. So far, these blocks are taking between 2 and 4 hours to complete...
