Beginning Quilters Program

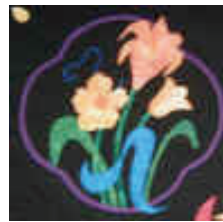

This is an opportunity to practice those appliqué skills or learn some new ones. Participants will learn how to use a hera marker, bias tape maker and pattern overlay to appliqué an art nouveau style design. The finished 14"x14" project can be used as a quilt center, small quilt, or completed as a pillow.



Registration will begin in February (\$20 for members). Registration is limited so please remember to register and pick up your materials list.

April 22nd (1:00pm)—"Fabrics, Fun and the First Ladies"

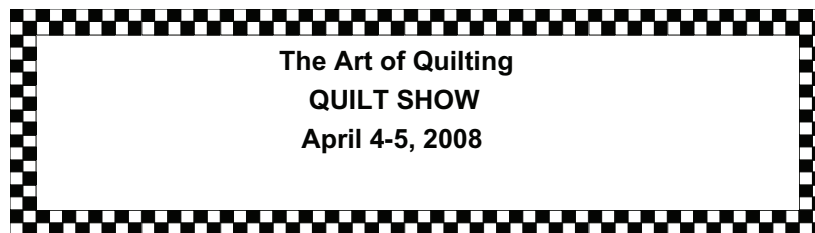

CHARITY BEE NEWS

Our February sew-in was most productive, with 92 Charity Bee members participating. When we waded through the huge pile of bears, we discovered that we had well over 120 finished ones. Making kits seemed to be popular, and we checked out 157 in all. There were 16 bear kits, 77 pillow pals, 24 lap quilts, 7 stockings, 22 wheelchair bags, and 11 toiletry bags distributed to members. Hopefully, most of these will be returned in March, all finished and ready for distribution. Thanks to everyone who helped.

We were especially pleased with the enthusiasm for Pillow Pals. We will have close to 100 if all the kits come back in. There are a few kits still available, so if you didn't get one, pick it up at the meeting. And to those who drew faces--you're amazing. We have enough faces to make about 75 more toys.

The members of the charity committee are hoping to get together in April to distribute some of our wares to various places. We hope to have a caravan going to Bedford and Franklin counties, visiting hospitals, nursing homes, rescue squads and the like. We haven't firmed up a date, but if you'd like to join us, talk to Marcia Wright or Sandra Ferguson. One of the joys of doing this work is seeing where the items go and hearing the accolades from the recipients. Irene Capps took 30 bears with her last week to take to the Franklin County Hospital emergency room.

So, get to work. Try to bring your items back all finished by the March meeting. There are a lot of children and elderly folks who need them. Remember, for each thing you complete, you get a slip in the drawing box for charity door prizes.

Items will be collected the second week in April so there is time to donate to both the Carilion Hospice and the Pet Adoption Center, both the end of April and both important charities.



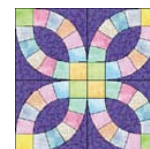

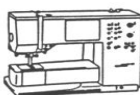

MOUNTAIN COMFORTS – THINKING AHEAD

Though we are all busy - busy - busy getting ready for **"The Art of Quilting,"** there is more quilt show fun coming! Your gorgeous quilts can have another opportunity to be admired this fall -- enter them in the Mountain Comforts XX Quilt Show. The Blue Ridge Folklife Festival will be Saturday, October 25. Adding to the excitement will be the changes and improvements to the Farm Museum area of the Ferrum campus. The 1800 barn has been moved and is being restored. Other features of the farm will be enhanced by the expansion of the farm area. On the main campus there is more change -- the obsolete solar panels which covered the hillside are gone. A new dormitory, to accommodate the increased enrollment, is being constructed on the site.

When we have all recuperated from our Guild's Show, and we've cut, sewn, stuffed, quilted a few truckloads of charity projects, remember Mountain Comforts needs lots of helping hands. Please let me know if you or your Bee can work on the show! For the show to survive beyond this year, help is needed. Also **REMEMBER -- IN KEEPING WITH THE FOLK-LIFE FESTIVAL'S HERITAGE THEME, THERE WILL BE A FEED SACK CATEGORY AGAIN THIS YEAR!!!!** That includes both old and new quilts which have a significant portion of feed sack fabric (50% - ish). If you are interested in making this type of "heritage" quilt, feed sacks may be found from many sources -- on-line, at auctions, quilt magazine ads, quilt show vendors, antique stores. At last year's Mountain Comforts Show, I donated some of my sack collection which we sold. Proceeds help cover the show expenses. This spring I am donating more of my feed sack stash which the Blue Ridge Institute will have for sale in the Museum's gift shop.
