Annette Ornelas will be doing two workshops and our program in September. Annette is a nationally known quilter, author, lecturer and workshop presenter. You can learn more about Annette at www.southwindquilts.com. On September 23 she will provide a 3 hour workshop on "Tiptoe Through the Tulips" (9AM-Noon). Participants will learn Annette's dimensional curved piecing techniques. It looks complex but is easy

to piece. (\$20 for members plus a \$9 pattern fee. All levels.)

Annette's "Dimensional Curved Piecing or Peeled-Back Patchwork" will be the focus of our September program. You won't want to miss her lecture and trunk show.

Annette will also be presenting a full day workshop on Wednesday, September 24 (9AM-3:30PM). "Mexican Stars Wall-hanging" is a very popular workshop with easy dimensional curves and easy strip piecing. No matter the color combination this is a spectacular wall-hanging. (\$26 for members plus a \$9 pattern fee. All levels)

There are still a few openings in "Tiptoe Through the Tulips" and "Mexican Stars Wall-hanging." There is a bit of "advance prep work" for each of these workshops so that class time with Annette can be spent "stitching." P.S. You will love the supply list: The objective in this workshop is for students to learn the basics, and the fun and freedom of freeform piecing! Students will bring scraps and strips to share with others in the class so that everyone has a variety of fabrics to play with. Bonnie will demonstrate a variety of ways to piece crumb blocks. She'll bring her own Crumb quilts for inspiration. Please come with a basket, a box, a bin, a bag of scraps you've had sitting around! Bring strings (long tapered strips), strips, squares, bricks, trimmings from joining binding on the bias, odd sized triangles, left over binding



pieces....in a wide variety of colors! Lights, darks, mediums, prints, solids, batiks, calicoes, bring it ALL!

In addition to your fabric you will need the basics: Sewing machine in working order (including power cords and extension cords), thread, scissors, seam ripper, pins, (and any other notions you usually sew with), rotary cutter, mat and ruler.

Note: Bonnie likes a variety of rulers, and for crumb piecing, she really loves a 6" or 6.5" square ruler. Other ruler sizes she often uses are 3.5" square, a 5" square (This one was a dear jane ruler, and she really likes the size of it, but it isn't mandatory....) and a regular 6.5" X 12.5" ruler.

Our Program (1:00PM) will be Scrap User's System—This lecture takes you through Bonnie's years of scrap quilting and how she has organized her scraps and leftovers to be easily accessible and workable into



her quilt making. Also includes discussion of tools of the trade that she finds helpful in her scrap using. Bonnie is a scrap USER, not just a scrap saver! There is a difference....this lecture will inspire quilters to organize their scraps and start turning them into beautiful quilts. (Graphics used with permission from Bonnie Hunter.)

November 25 Program

Our November program will be "Hands On Demo of the Whole Quilt Method." Corinne Shibley, author of <u>The Right Side of Quilting</u>, will be bringing kits so that

we can each try out her unique approach to quilting. Please bring basic sewing supplies: a pencil, scissors, heavy duty quilting pins (the thin ones bend), a sharp embroidery (not quilting) needle and thread. A thimble is optional. This meeting will have a non-member guest fee of \$5.00 to cover the kit fee. Members are free.

CHARITY BEE NEWS

We were so excited to see all the items that came in at the August meeting. We collected 30 bibs, 6 bears, 3 sweaters, 55 pillow pals (thanks to Alice Vreeland's 50), 12 Christmas stockings, 12 wheelchair bags, 12 pillow cases, 9 quilts, and 15 cosmetic bags.

We mentioned the cool scarves that can be made for the military. There is a link on our web site to the directions. Please notice that they are very particular about colors. If you are interested in making these, please hold on to them until the **February** meeting, at which time we will gather all together and make one shipment. We won't make this an ongoing project.

If you are making pillowcases, it would help if you would put a tie on them, just sewn into the side seam near the top, so they could be closed if necessary. The kids use these to carry their belongings in. The Social Services people in Rocky Mount would also like guilts for teens and pillowcases, so keep them coming.

On Thursday, September 4, Sandy Kelso, Alice Vreeland and Sandra Ferguson gathered up as much stuff as we could cram in the car and headed for Rocky Mount. We distributed 51 pillow pals, 12 bears, 18 guilts, 9 sweaters, 2 caps, 6 pair mittens, 6 tote bags, and 20 wheelchair bags. Everywhere we were met with gracious and grateful people. When we took a couple of lap guilts to Hospice, the gentleman in charge told us how much the patients loved the guilts. He said one lady loved hers so much, that when she died, her family buried her guilt with her.

The pillow pals are a big hit. The Family Resource Center (battered women's shelter) said they currently had 11 children in residence, and would like one for each child. In addition to the Resource Center and Hospice, we delivered items to the Franklin County Hospital emergency room (they were completely out of bears and pillow pals), Franklin Healthcare Center (they love the wheelchair bags), the Franklin County Sheriff's office, and Social Services (foster care).

On Saturday, September 6, Katherine Lewis and some friends delivered things to our Bedford charities. They took 30 bibs to the County Nursing Home, 7 bears and 5 pillow pals to the Bedford Hospital emergency room, and 10 pillow pals and 5 make up bags to the Domestic Violence center. Thanks so much, ladies.

So keep on making what ever you like to do. We have a use and a need for all the things. Plan on going along with us on a future delivery. We had a great time, and got to go out to lunch after we finished the deliveries. Alice was especially taken with the comments about the pillow pals. It's so rewarding to make so many people happy.

I know why I have not received your entry forms for the Mountain Comforts Show -- you are going to hand them to me at our meeting on September 23 -- right????? If you do plan on mailing -- reminder: Entries should be post-marked by October 1st. Why so early? The show booklet needs to be typed, printed, collated, and stapled. Which reminds me -- Who would like to volunteer to help with that mammoth undertaking? I'm hoping to arrange work space at the Rocky Mount Library for Wednesday, October 22 or Thursday October 23 for a work party similar to the fabulous one that prepared the 2,500 entry form mail packets! Let me know if you can help! The electric stapler will be there!

Thanks to all who worked on the ribbons -- sewing streamers and gathering circles! If my aging embroidery machines would decide to cooperate, the middles would have been made. Anyway, I think I will be needing some help on Tuesday, September 30th. I'll know better at our September meeting. Check with me then and I'll take your names and let you know for certain.

Those entering quilts will receive an "Exhibitor's Ribbon" which will admit you to all the events at the Folklife Festival including the Mountain Comforts Show. Along with the ribbon will be a list of drop-off locations. Quilts must reach those by the shop's closing time on Friday, October 10. Charles and I will be visiting the shops Saturday, October 11 or Monday, October 13; we pick up the quilts and take them to locked storage. On Wednesday, October 15, Joyce Moorman and her crew of "taggers" will be meeting to prepare the quilts for judging. Quilts may also be hand delivered, UPSed, Fed-Exed, or mailed to the Blue Ridge Institute in time to reach there by October 14. [Note: Monday, October 13, is Columbus Day, a holiday; no postal service and other delivery.]

Judging is October 16 and 17. Joyce Noell is lining up the crew to help the judging team. This is one job everyone LOVES and being a volunteer is coveted. It is also an opportunity to work along side of quilters from other guilds. Other


