MATERIAL LIST FOR SIBERIAN IRIS

- 13" to 13 1/2" square for background fabric.
- 2 to 3 different greens for leaves and stems
- 2 to 3 different colors for iris
- Thread to match
- Straight Pins I like the long 1 3/8 " with white head

Pattern (designed by Sue Palmer) and pattern ease will be furnished on class day.

Kinza Pickelsmeier Bio - I joined the guild in January 2003, knowing very little about quilting. I had already started the wedding ring quilt several years earlier and had put it away unfinished. After retiring I decided to finish the quilt by taking it completely apart and resewing it correctly. I had quilted it not understanding the proper sandwiching technique. Needless to say the quilt looked well made as long as you did not look at the back.

Over the last 3 or 4 years my interest has evolved to hand appliqué. Betty Hatfield's beautiful appliqué quilts had a significant influence in my desire to learn how to appliqué. I took classes for 3 years at the Elly Scienkiewicz Appliqué Academy in Williamsburg, two years from Nancy Kern, New Jersey and one year from Shirley Bloomfield, England.

My first appliqué quilt was made using different techniques. Since then I have found my niche, combining different appliqué techniques to achieve the results I desire.

Bunge, have, for the last nine years toured with a program of songs, stories and quilts to guilds and quilting events across North America, Australia, New Zealand, The UK and Germany. Cathy is also an accomplished quilt teacher in Hexagons as well as hand and machine appliqué.

Start with the Grandmother's Flower Garden and then transplant it to new growing zones using the English paper piecing technique. Students will be learning the easiest way to sew hexagons, eliminating two steps in the traditional technique by using plastic reusable Quilt Patis templates. The flower garden will be appliqued onto a background fabric. The rest of the 3-hour class will concentrate on designing new patterns using hexagons. Bring home a ready-to-piece Grandmother's Flower Garden block, and a whole slew of ideas o how to make other designs using hexagons. Hand piecing suitable for beginners - 3 hour class.

Kit of 7 Quilt Patis hexagon templates and design sheets provided - purchase required (\$5.00).

SUPPLY LIST:

Six 2-3/4" precut squares of petal fabric One 6-1/2" square background fabric Contrasting basting thread

Scissors A few small straight pins

one 2-3/4" precut square of centre fabric hand-sewing needles matching thread to petals pencil/pen for designing



June Teacher Bio - Bunny Goode

Bunny Goode is a self-taught mixed media artist, designer and instructor from Point Pleasant, NJ. ("down the shore...")

Bunny teaches fabric design and doll making throughout the US, with her primary focus along the Eastern seaboard. Her designs have been welcomed in world-class galleries, shows, and by collec-

As a teenager she began making her own clothes out of necessity. (She was 6' tall at age 12!) While in school she worked in a fabric store to support her need for fabric. She has since lost interest in making clothes for herself, but her love for fabric continues and is obvious as a doll and fabric artist, designer and instructor. Her flair for color and ability to blend textures are boldly evident in her designs.

Then came soft sculpture! What started out as little soft sculpture stocking faces on refrigerator magnets rapidly branched out into cloth doll making. Her dolls are not play dolls rather they are art dolls.

She became active in the quilting community through a friend who owned a quilt shop. That experience helped to further her exposure owned a quilt shop. That experience helped to further her exposure to fabrics and colors, always helping with customers' color palettes for classes. Bunny's first quilting experience was a beginner class for classes. Bunny's first quilting experience was a beginner class, a simple 9-patch, but when she found her mind wandering away from the basic pattern she realized that traditional quilt making was not her forte. However, using the wonderful techniques from guilting has led her to design and prepare fantasy fabrics for use in many fiber arts. Fantasy and humor are Bunny's favorite themes.

As her artwork expanded, so did her choice of materials! Nothing is sacred anymore as an example, she recently realized the little pouch that vine tomatoes comes in makes a wonderful texture to interweave into her fabrics (well, after she ate the tomatoes, of course!!), and in her house there is no such thing as a piece of "scrap" fabric! Bunny uses it all with gleeful abandon.

Bunny has developed a line of patterns than span the range from the very basic to a more intensive, advanced series of designs. Recently, Newark Dressmaker Supply picked up one of her patterns, "Sewnya" a little pin cushion doll, for their Winter 2010 catalogue.

Bunny has been very fortunate to have had the opportunity to teach, study and travel throughout the United States while living her dream of being a fabric and doll artist, designer and instructor. Her nearly constant companions include Ed, her husband and partner for more than 30 years, who is a Juilliard trained bassist/musician (moonlighting as an executive during the day) and their little four-legged girl, Morgan, an 8 year old Shih Tzu who is the love of their lives and the biggest pain in the "you-know-what" of their lives!


