There was a teacher mix-up in April for the Block of the Month and you will be getting double blocks for a couple of months to catch up..sorry about that!

**June 29** The June workshop has lots of room....come on, gals, think about your nieces, granddaughters, friends who might like a personally designed one of a kind fabric purse. I am going to make a dressy black on black purse using several different black fabrics and glitz..for me! Think about denim for young folks, or ???? Ladies, is it imagination time, that's why the supply list is entitled....

Rotary Cutter and small matScissorsSewing machineOpen toe footTopstitch needleAssorted matching threads - rayon, polys, variegated - colors to go with yourfabric choicesBobbin threads lite or dark - depending on the color of your backing fabric.You won't see it - so that is not major.

BASE FABRIC: Not a busy print. A solid, batik or similar is nice - in your theme colors. This piece should be as least the size of a fat quarter. This will make a nice size bag for your first one.

BACKING FABRIC: Batting - If you are making a bag. And I really like using an iron-on batting/fleece as this gives the bag a bit ore stability. You can also use your finished piece for clothing or, as I do for my dolls. In that case, you can back your piece with muslin, same size as your base fabric.

A piece of TULLE to cover the piece, slightly larger than your base fabric and backing. Once you have determined your other colors, you can choose the tulle. Tulle needs to be auditioned because it can change the whole look of your fabric. ....continued on page 3

You need to bring several different fabrics as well. A small amount of each is needed and as many or as few as you desire. These will be cut with the rotary cutter into smaller approximately 2" size. These fabrics can be plain or glitzy or a combination. Some sheers add charm. You may also want to look for trims - yarns, embroidery floss, Kreinik, rick rack, etc. These can be placed under the tulle or on top and "couched." Other embellishments include Angelina, silk petals and leaves. These things you can sew over. I will bring my glitz stash box or assorted fabrics to share.

LINING FABRIC: Inside your bag—your choice of cotton or poly to match/contrast (same size)

This sounds like a good time to bring in those bits and pieces you just couldn't throw out and might use some day...that day is June 29, 9AM at the workshop. Note the date..this is the FIFTH Tuesday of the month and the last time this year we have to change our usual schedule.

July - I will have the Fractured Flower samples and sign up board. Sandra Ferguson, teacher.

August - Civil War embroidery, Karen Witt, teacher. BOM folks take note - this will REALLY ENHANCE your quilt blocks!

And remember...Cotton Theory is coming in September, so \$ave up. The course is a bit more expen\$sive, but you GET EVERYTHING - a PRE-CUT KIT, THREAD AND BOBBIN. Just ask any of the ladies who did this on retreat last year...and you will be rushing to sign up for this class again...with Sue Wilson and Momma Betty.
