We welcome and strongly encourage exhibitor participation.

Please note: ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED.

All entries are judged by professional judges and exquisite hand-made ribbons are awarded in each category.

We proudly present our features quilter - Glenda George from Floyd, VA. Glenda's artistic versatility inspires her quilting and helped her to create a fascinating array of art quilts as well as a large collection of art pieces.

Once again we offer a professional category for entered quilts - you are eligible if you have won a "Best of Show" ribbon at any quilt show. Visitors can expect to get inspired by the work of nationally and internationally known quilt artists. ## **Guidelines for Workshops**

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please call **Susan Palmer at 721-5299** as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.

# Quilt Guild Challenge 2010 Girls Gotta Have Fun! Scrappy quilt.

Think about how you can use your scraps.....in "Girls Gotta Have Fun" scrappy quilt challenge 2010.

More important, have fun creating it!

Lets go over the rules:

- 1. Maximum size crib quilt; no minimum size.
- 2. Maximum size of a piece of fabric on the front 6"; no minimum size.
- 3. If there are borders on the quilt it needs to follow the size requirements in #2.
- 4. A scrap is left over fabric from a previous project.
- 5. Bindings and backing do not have to follow the scrap sizes.
