A painter before a quilter, Linda started quilting as a hobby in 1980. Soon she was making pictorial quilts using appliqué of fabrics and embroidery thread as her paints and brushes. Linda's specialty is humorous pictorial applique. Her award-winning quilts have been exhibited nationally, including the **AQS**, **IQAS**, **NQAS**, Quilters Heritage Show, Silver Dollar City Quilt Show, Quilt America!, Dollywood Quilt Show, Indiana Heritage Show, The David and Peter Mancuso Shows. Her works are at Duke University, Southern Highland Craft Guild, and at Winston Salem and Duke Hospitals. Linda spends her time quilting, teaching quilting, or visualizing the next one.

Linda will be teaching a workshop "Fairies and Morning Glories" and the lecture for the Guild Meeting will be "Applique...I did it my way".

November 22, 2011 — Neva Hart

Neva will be our speaker (No Workshop). She is a local Quilt Appraiser and Historian in Virginia...**AQS** Certified. She is President of the Professional Assn. of Appraisers-Quilted Textiles. She will be doing the program on "How to Value and ADD Value to your Quilts". She will discuss how appraisers place a value on quilts and what today's quilt makers can do to make their work valuable for the future.

January 24, 2012 — Jill Schetel

Guidelines for Workshops

Block of the Month 2011 Row by Row Mystery Quilt

I hope the time off has given you the opportunity to finish the rows and not be too frustrated. We're getting close to completing our Seminole Sampler project. This month we'll decide in what order we want to put our rows together and get measurements for borders. I'll also have a couple of projects for the left-over scraps of our rows.

In October, we will be finishing the quilt; borders, binding, accent strips and backing. November will be show-and-tell month for us. I'm looking forward to hearing all about how the quilt went together. You ladies have come up with some great suggestions as we've come through the year. Thanks.

Attention! I messed up the directions for putting together row 10. It should be sewn together **light, dark, medium.** The instructions read **light, medium, dark**, but the diagram shows **light, dark, medium**. If you already have sewn it together, leave it and put it together as is. You'll have your own unique row!


Charity Bee Workshop News
