This month's meeting will be moved to the **Third Week** in May due to a church activity. Featured speaker will be Debby Kratovil, who has been Special Projects Editor with QUILT magazine for 15 years, with over 600 articles published. In 2006 alone, she saw 54 of her quilts published, with another dozen sewn for major fabric companies. Twenty-five of her quilts made the cover of quilting magazines, nine in 2006. She is a popular teacher both locally and nationally, as many happy students will attest. Debby wrote Bold, Black, & Beautiful Quilts (AQS, 2004), two quilting calendars for Accord Publishing (2006 & 2007), Quilter's Block-a-Day Calendar w/CD by That Patchwork Place (2007). Her book, Supersize 'Em Quilts, is filled with 22 projects to appeal to any guilter's taste. Debby is a prolific guilter, designer, and illustrator. Best of all, she enjoys every minute of it. Currently she designs and sews guilts for three fabric companies while working on another book. She loves to travel and teach. Work for the Original Sewing and Quilt Expo takes her to nine cities a year. Debby uses her wide range of quilting skills to take a pile of fabric to a finished quilt, then to creating the pattern with professional print-ready illustrations. Debby says, "I've never met a fabric I didn't like." One of her special talents is making a beautiful quilt using challenging fabric collections. Because she is on such good terms with her computer and computerized sewing machines, she can take a project from start to finish quickly. She lives in Fairfax, VA with Phil(husband) and Belle(dog). She has three grown daughters.


### June 28, 2011 — Martha Akers
