August 23, 2011—Paula Golden

We are delighted to have Paula Golden this month. She will present a lecture, "A Journey Through Virginia Quilt" for the Guild Meeting. Paula was selected as the "Quilt Teacher of the Year" by the Professional Quilter Magazine and is co-author of the book "Quilts of Virginia: Birth of America Through the Eye of a Needle". Paula is President of the Board of Directors at the Virginia Quilt Museum in Harrisonburg.

September 27, 2011—Judy Loope

Another wonderful teacher and speaker is Judy Loope. A resident of Salem, she began traditional quilting in the early 1990s, learning the techniques and tips of sewing. As an occasional quilter with young children the sewing machine became her friend, but finished pieces were few and far between. In the mid-90s, Judy made the transition from traditional to art quilts. Learning to dye, paint, print and embellish cloth, Judy realized the tactile process of working with fabrics and experimenting with material is what she enjoyed most. Inspiration for her work comes from the materials, nature, and experiments in her studio. Judy's work is shown nationally and internationally and is represented in galleries around Virginia. She also works as a commission artist for BoardWalk Consulting in Atlanta, GA, creating award-winning quilts for the Center for Disease Control, the Mayor of Atlanta, and CEOs of companies. Her lecture will be "What Was I Thinking?" and the morning workshop will be "Heat Strokes" with an added demo on "Rust Stains". Sign up now!!



Linda Cantrell started quilting as a hobby in 1980. She never dreamed that she would be teaching quilting coast to coast as she does today. She was a painter before taking up quilting and soon she was thinking of pictorial quilts. Applique was a natural choice with fabrics and embroidery thread becoming her paints and brushes. She is self-taught in qpplique and quilting and her specialty is humorous pictorial appliqué. Her award winning quilts have been exhibited nationally, including the AQS, IQAS, NQAS, Quilters Heritage Show, Silver Dollar City Quilt Show, Quilt America!, The David and Peter Mancuso Shows, Dollywood Quilt Show, Indiana Heritage Show and many others. She has works in private collections as well as the Governor's Residence, Duke University, Southern Highlands Craft Guild and Winston Salem and Duke Hospitals. Her work also has been published in many magazines and books. Creating quilts of her own designs is her specialty with her time spent quilting, teaching quilting or thinking about the next one.
