3 hour workshop — \$18 plus materials. (Kits will be available to buy for the workshop.) Class minimum is 15.

Karen will demo this process which allows you to create one or multiple quilted picture frames. The embellishing is the exciting and fun part of this project. Visit Karen Carter's website: http://web.mac.com/klcquilts to see her work, scheduled lectures and classes.

When Karen Lee Carter was diagnosed with cancer at age 40, things she had previously put off to do "someday" suddenly became more imperative. For Karen, who learned to sew in elementary school, quilting provided a different kind of sewing experience: one that required new tools and a concentration that served as an artistic distraction from the circumstances of her health.

Thirteen years later and cancer-free, Karen's fabric art quilts recently adorned the walls of Meyers Oberndorf Central Library in Virginia Beach. She did commission quilt work for ten years and for the last two years she's led classes and lectured about quilt making and various techniques.

She believes regardless of cancer, she would've begun to quilt: however, through her illness, she lost the fear of putting herself and her work on display. "As a cancer survivor, you get a sense of your choices in life and the power you have over them."

"I feel that getting touch with my creativity and expressing myself through my quilts was so therapeutic and transforming, it motivated me to share my work and my knowledge with others."

2 + 2 = 2012 Quilt Challenge

Remember when we were very young and so proud that we knew the answer to 2 + 2? Well, the 2012 quilt challenge asks you to come up with the answer to that question once again, only this time in your challenge quilt.

The rules are simple:

- 1. Use **two colors** and only two colors of fabric. Different shades of each color are acceptable. White <u>does</u> count as one of the colors. So does **black**.
- 2. Incorporate **two quilting techniques** in your project. Techniques include, but are not limited to traditional piecing, paper piecing, applique, thread painting, redwork, embroidery, English paper piecing, etc.

That's it! There are no other rules, so have fun and make the two color quilt that has been on your quilting "bucket list" for so long!

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the
 waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those
 who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to



Bring your lunch and beverage!


