NOTICE

A special meeting of the guild to vote on the proposed increase in dues and changes to the Guild By-Laws will be held at the September meeting.

Last month at the meeting I mentioned your Boards' recommendation for a dues increase. Here are the particulars of that recommendation:

- 1) Increase membership dues from \$20 to \$25.
- **2)** Dues will be accepted starting at the October meeting and continuing through December 31st. Forms will be available on line and at the membership table.
- 3) Only completed membership forms and payment will be accepted at the December luncheon. The Membership Chairman will be present to receive this information.
- **4)** Members who have not renewed their membership by December 31st will not be listed in the roster completed by the Membership Chairman for the following year.
- **5)** Membership cards and the membership roster will be available on line no later than the January meeting.
- 6) Membership renewals will be \$25.
- **7)** Membership dues for new members join before June 30 will be \$25 and \$12.50 for those who join after June 30th.

If the membership approves these changes we will also need to change the wording in our By-Laws to reflect the new information. A copy of the proposed changes will be attached to the newsletter.

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to
 take your place. Please call Teena Livsey(576-2031) or Sharon Reilly(297-1926) as soon as you know you can't
 come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then
 find your own replacement.


