Guidelines for Workshops

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the

- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to

Charity News

February 26 9 a.m.—2 p.m.

We need everyone to help get ready for our fun work day at the February meeting. We will be stuffing and sewing bears, assembling Pillow Pals, and making kits or working on other projects.

We would like to ask members to sew bears together ready for stuffing and make sets of arms and legs (stuffed) for Pillow Pals. Patterns are available from the Charity Table. The Pillow Pal arm and leg patterns are available on the web site. We would like to finish a large number of these toys since our inventory is depleted.

What can you bring? Your machine, if you would like to sew. We need a few people to sew arms, legs and ears of the bears as they are stuffed. We will need several ladies to work on Pillow Pals, and if we have enough people and fabric plus batting, we can make quilt-as-you-go lap quilts. Bring thread and needles, scissors, a few pins, and thimble if you use one. Some batting and Pillow Pal backs cut in 9" x 12" pieces would be helpful. Don't forget to bring your lunch. There should be cake for dessert as we celebrate our anniversary.

Have you made a resolution to clean out your sewing room? Please look for ribbon...we need a lot for the bears...strips of batting, extra material (pink and tan plain fabrics are needed for Pillow Pal faces, cut 9" x 12"), and left over squares from your projects. It is amazing what you can create from other people's discards.

We need twin sized quilts. Our foster care and shelter people really use them, and we have none in our inventory. The committee is so grateful for all you have done in the past year, and hope you will continue to support this part of our guild.

The nursing home in Bedford can always use bibs made from bath towels; the small, cheap ones work the best. Bedford Hospice likes the travel size pillows with cases, and all our nursing homes can use wheelchair bags and totes. If you have some leftover Christmas fabric, we will need stockings for next Christmas. We have resolved to make at least four deliveries a year to Bedford and Franklin Counties, as so much is needed.

Thanks for helping. We look forward to seeing you in February.
