Using a panel (cheaters cloth) you will practice the techniques involved. Because the panel is inexpensive and there is no piecing to do, it is a perfect practice piece. There are a lot of panels available so we are sure you will find one to work on. There are many areas on a panel that lend themselves to some very intricate design planning and this will allow you to learn and execute these designs. Sounds like fun but educational. 
