



Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the
 waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those
 who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to
 take your place. Please call Pat Blice(540-890-6226) or Kate Holdgreve(540-890-2027) as soon as you know you can't come
 and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find
 your own replacement.

We had a successful sew-in on March 26. Thanks to everyone who came and worked so hard. Here is the count for what we took in or made at the Quilt-In....394.

Bears...156 Baby Quilts...13

Pillow Pals...39 Lap Quilts...12

Wheel Chair Bags...26 Large Quilts...3

Totes...7 Knitted Caps...9

Pillowcases...10 Xmas Stockings...107

Travel-sized Pillows...2 Bibs...10

Isn't that amazing? We will be organizing deliveries for April and will getting these things out to folks who need them. We should have enough bears for the year, and with the pillow pals still to come in, should have enough in that category as well.

Our biggest needs right now are twin-sized quilts and pillowcases. We are really short on both. Hope the bees will come through with some. We can use wheelchair bags and totes, bibs, and baby caps at any time. Because we have promised the Bedford Hospice 25 lap quilts for Christmas, we can use more of them. Thanks to all of you who took unfinished things home, to bring back later, ready for delivery.

If you use fabric and supplies of your own and/or pay for quilting and would like a tax receipt so you can deduct the expenses on your taxes, please see Marnie.

We will have the charity table set up at every meeting. Make sure you sign your donations in or see Marnie or Sandra to register what you bring in. There are still some larger pieces of quilt fabric in our storage which bees can use for backs for the twin quilts we've challenged you to make.
