Lake Quilters' Guild was established in January of 1990 to serve the communities surrounding Smith Mountain Lake. The fourth Tuesday of each month informal meetings promote good fellowship and the interchange of ideas in the art and craft of quilting. Guest speakers and members stimulate knowledge of all aspects of quilting through workshops, educational demonstrations, a monthly newsletter and by sharing, appreciating and enjoying each other's work.

Also in this folder were photos (and negatives) of the first quilt show. Your newsletter editor attended this show with first and second grade students from Sontag Elementary School who had been reading many quilt stories and making a quilt. What a wonderful surprise to see teachers, students, and parent chaperones from almost two decades ago.

As Ginnie Watson has stated, we will celebrate our 24th anniversary in 2014, our grand 25th in 2015.

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please call Pat Blice(890-6226) or Kate Holdgreve(890-2027) as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.
