2015 PROGRAMMING PLAN

January 26, 2015

Workshop—9 a.m.-2 p.m.—MONDAY—"A Little Touch of Craziness" —Avis Withers, a member of our guild, will teach us to create a small bag with a "Victorian style crazy quilt design" on the front. Various stitches will be used as well as embellishments. A kit will be provided of all necessary threads and embellishments to create your masterpiece. You need to bring straight pins, an air erasable marker, a small pair of scissors and needle threader. You may also need a light or magnifying glass for your own comfort. A break will be provided so bring your lunch if you wish. At this time the workshop is full but you may add your name to our waiting list in case we have a cancellation. Cost of the workshop is \$20 with a kit fee of \$15.

BUNNIE JORDAN AT NATIONAL QUILTING DAY EVENT IN CHRISTIANSBURG, VA MAR. 21 - Paula Golden (McL) writes; "Montgomery Museum Director Sue Farrar and Christiansburg Library Manager Pamela Hale are excited to announce that National Quilting Day will be celebrated in events in Christiansburg, VA on Saturday, March 21, 2015. The day will be highlighted by special guest Bunnie Jordan (McL), an acclaimed quilter, textile appraiser, and collector. Events include quilt appraisals conducted by appointment at the Museum from $9 \, \text{AM} - 1 \, \text{PM}$, and a quilt presentation and reception for the public from $3 \, \text{PM} - 5 \, \text{PM}$ at the Library, located at 125 Sheltman Street in Christiansburg.

Bunnie is looking forward to meeting area quilters and sharing her quilting story: "Quilting is an important part of my life. Whether studying old quilts or making new ones, I'm guaranteed a learning experience, an exchange with friends, and satisfying that need to just touch fabric and see what it can become. I feel fortunate to have found an interest and passion that gives back on so many levels." She is co-author of the book, Quilts of Virginia 1607-1899, available for checkout at the Library. According to the National Quilting Association's website, the first National Quilting Day was observed in 1992 and since then it has grown into a global celebration for all quiltmakers and quilt lovers.
