


Workshop Guidelines

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 p.m. at the guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up.
- Only people who have signed-up **AND** paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time. Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please contact Diana Brown and Kathy Gunderson as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. 

Fall 1993 Members were encouraged to sign up for their "dish" for the December 14 Christmas Potluck. Before the November meeting, 36 people had indicated they would attend.

11/1993 Velma Meador, Suzan Burch, Bettie Comer, Stella Fisher and Betty Leisure finished hand quilting the whole cloth raffle quilt on November 9. It was put on the frame on October 9! Those who did not get to help quilt will have a chance to help by selling raffle tickets.

11/1993 Elaine Klos won First Place-Applique at Mountain Comforts V, the Blue Ridge Institute Quilt Show in October. Here is what she shared about how it felt to be a winner....

I WON! I WON! I WON!

This is Elaine, who never took a quilting stitch until Ginny Watson put the ad in the newspaper and all of the more knowledgeable women in the group took the time and patience to teach the new "quilters". Betty Hatfield was so thorough in her applique lessons and a large part of my success is due to her. Ginny was always there with words of encouragement and I needed many. Thank you! There were so many hugs and congratulatory calls that I feel I'm sharing my award with my "extended family" of quilters.

I have to include the narrative on a card my eldest daughter sent – it seems to be the general consensus in our family:

"Congratulations! I knew you could do it! Well, I didn't exactly KNOW you could do it...but I had a strong suspicion...and an inkling sorta...I thought you might...I mean, I considered it within the realm of possibility...a long shot maybe, but not TOTALLY out of the question...OK! OK! You really surprised me."

1/94 Outgoing President Alba Papa's Challenge Anything Goes does not have to be quilted, but it should use piecing or applique techniques. I must contain some of either or both the red or the green checked "Centennial Classics", a Marcus Brothers fabric. The quilt show committee wants these challenge items plus those from the previous two challenges (the feather stuff of Ginny's and the green of Suzan's) for display at the June Show.

At the March 24 guild meeting, look for the scrap book display of challenge fabrics and photos of preparations for the first Lake Quilters' Show. How many of us are like Elaine Klos...thankful for the encouragement, knowledge and patience of our guild members
