October 24 – 9 – 3..."Rock That Block – Juicy Lucy"...instructor Linda Haun



This class is designed to give students permission to PLAY! You will learn how to divide a block into sections and calculate the size of the pieces using simple Quilter's Math. Then you and Linda will explore how merely changing a color or rotating a patch a quarter turn can change the dynamics of the block. Linda will also share some quilts that can be made using one or a combination of the block from the Sampler that create awesome secondary patterns! TONS of design possibilities! This class teaches you: piecing, Quilter's Math, color and design – all in one workshop. FUN DAY!

This class is offered by popular demand due to the large number of requests by guilds. Everyone loves the "Tottenville Toads" quilt – but it is way too big for a workshop project...SO this is a small version to help you get started! Students will learn basic foundation piecing for the border, Linda's ONE PIN method of creating New York Beauty blocks and then fusible raw edge machine applique. A kit (\$15) required: re-usable foundation piecing stencils, pattern for the water lily and lettering and foundation paper (which stays inside the quilt – WOW) to complete the project.

Workshop Guidelines 2016

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of quilters (generally between 10 to 20) to learn new patterns and new techniques, to develop deeper threads of friendship and to obtain valued instruction from the guest speaker. Please follow these **guidelines** when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign up will begin at the monthly guild meeting three or more months prior to the workshop.
- Three months or more prior to the workshop, the sign up will be offered to our guild members. Two months prior, if the workshop is not filled, the workshop will be opened to other guilds and to the general public at an additional fee. One month prior to the workshop, if not filled, the workshop will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- Once the workshop is filled, a "waiting" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. If you need to cancel, please do not find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.
- Once you have signed up for a workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you will not receive a refund unless your spot is filled. Please contact Bette Gove and/or Kay McCoy as soon as you know you can't come and if applicable, the next person on the waiting list will be contacted. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement. Please advise Bette and/or Kay who this person is and their contact information.

Stephanie reported that there has been a problem getting anyone to help clean up after Guild meetings. The main duties are to put away extra chairs, and empty the trash. In the past, there have been several solutions, none of which were effective. At one point there was someone appointed to clean up after the meetings, then it fell to Programs, and then all members were asked to clean up. None of these have worked, and Programs have too much responsibility with the program and speaker to have to stay and clean up as well. During Dottie Wilson's presidency, a board-approved directive was passed to include all members in set up and clean up at Guild meetings. It was decided that each month, the displaying Bee would be responsible. This board-approved directive is still in effect and will be until the board approves an alternative. Dawn thinks that there is a written list of responsibilities for each position, and believes that organizing clean up is the Bee Keeper's responsibility. Stephanie will try to find the list.

Kay and Dawn suggested that at the January Board meeting each year, that the by-laws, position responsibilities, and unique characteristics of our non-profit status be detailed, so that everyone is on the same page.

Christmas Lunch

Since there have been personnel changes and pricing changes at the Waterfront, we discussed alternatives for the luncheon. It was decided to have the luncheon catered at Trinity Ecumenical Church. Kay has reserved the church, and contacted the caterer. Bette made a motion to have the luncheon at the church, Fran seconded, and the motion was carried. Kay and the Hospitality Committee will meet with the caterer to discuss the menu. A Trinity rent donation of \$100 is required and not in the 2016 budget.

Charity Donations

The Board discussed suggestions of where to donate some of our funds, in keeping with our mission, and non-profit status. Examples included Lake Christian Ministries, SML Good Neighbors, Pidge Morgan's Tanzania project, scholarships for the area high school, and a scholarship for the NC State Textile program. Board members are to research ideas and bring suggestions to the next meeting.

Next meeting will be on August 1st at 1pm at the Moneta Library. Meeting was adjourned at 1:45pm.
