AUGUST 21...Workshop - "Mini Mosaics"...instructor Cheryl Lynch

This is a fun no sew workshop that imitates the ancient art of mosaics, inspired by Cheryl's trip to Israel. Learn how to create a mosaic picture from small pre-cut pieces of lots of colored fabric, using a technique Cheryl developed to simplify the process. Pick one of the available patterns/ kit in class that will finish a 9"x12" project that can be bordered and quilted to your preference at home. You ONLY need to bring tweezers and a sharp small scissors to use with a provided kit (\$16). There are only

5 places left. Cost is \$28. Call me to sign up or take your chances and sign up in July.

August 22 - Program - "Turning Travel into Treasures"...lecturer Cheryl Lynch

About Cheryl...Cheryl made her first quilt out of Marimekko fabric when she was attending graduate school. It took another 17 years to make a second one. Fascinated by the color and texture of fabric, Cheryl discovered she could create art and folk art without knowing how to paint with a brush. The challenge became how to turn her ideas into a quilt. She likes to build one section at a time by putting together the pieces of the puzzle, making the quilt challenging and energizing. This process sometimes necessitates the development of a new technique or use of non-traditional fabric.

September 25, 9am-3pm – Intermediate Machine Quilting – Instructor – Susie Jacobs. The class time will be spent exploring an assortment of designs for use in blocks, borders, and back-grounds. Each pattern will first be drawn on paper and then stitched on fabric. She will cover lots of tips and techniques needed for successful quilting, picking quilt designs to suit your quilt and how a little tweak can change the look of a design. There is only one place left in this class. Cost is \$35.00. (cont. on next page).

Susie Jacobs made her first quilt over 35 years ago and wishes she had kept count on how many quilts she has made since. She took her first machine quilting class 20 years ago and after a shaky start, began to enjoy the time spent creating designs on her quilts. Over the years, she has shared her love of quilting while working in quilt shops and teaching.

October 23, 9AM – 3 PM Our own Ceciely Sue Roth is doing a program on **Wool Applique.** She is going to teach various stitches to attach the appliques to each other and the background. This should be a fun project for the fall.

Present: Bette Gove, Jackie Hodgson, Shannan Maggied, Betty Reynolds, Cecily Sue Roth, Dawn Saunders, Stephanie Schaefer, Linda Walters, Sue Whitney

The president called the meeting to order at 2:30 PM.

Stephanie has delivered checks to Good Neighbors and LCM and will deliver the check to Food for Kids next week.

Programs (Bette Gove) reported the following:

August 21 – Mini-Mosaics Five spots are left for this workshop. Cost is \$28 + \$16 for kit.

September 25 – Susie Jacobs – Machine Quilting for Intermediates There is one spot left for this workshop.

October – Cecily Sue Roth – Hand Stitching on Wool

November - Rosemarie Newcomb is giving a lecture. Topic -TBD Shannan and Cecily Sue reported all programs for 2018 are ready to go. They will begin signing people up for the March 2018 workshop in October.

Membership remains at 150 members. It was reported that the average guild meeting attendance is about 70 people. Bette will be sure to have 75 booklets made up for the July meeting. Bette will be setting up about 12:20 and could use some help.

Cecily Sue has found a website that will make quilters' pins for \$2.10 each with no set up fee and free shipping. Dawn will check to see if there any pins left in storage before any pins are ordered.

Treasurer reported:

The checking account balance is down from last year but this is good because we were holding back too much money for a charitable organization.

Ways and Means has not brought in as much as usual so far this year.

Dawn asked: Will most expenses for workshops be covered by fees? Shannan and Bette agreed it is difficult to tell but costs shouldn't grow, so things should balance out by the end of the year.

The guild is on the mark with its spending according to the budget. We have spent about 50% of budgeted funds and we are half way through the year.

Stephanie reported that Children's School did not happen. Only two children signed up, one of whom had to cancel so "the school" was canceled.

Jackie Hodgson asked when she needed to have the raffle quilt completed. The board decided that tickets will go on sale at the October meeting. The quilt will be ready by that time.

The next board meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 7 at 1 PM at the Moneta Library.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:15.

Workshop Guidelines 2017

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of quilters (generally between 10 to 20) to learn new patterns and new techniques, to develop deeper threads of friendship and to obtain valued instruction from the guest speaker.

Please follow these **guidelines** when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign up will begin at the monthly guild meeting three or more months prior to the workshop.
- Three months or more prior to the workshop, the sign up will be offered to our guild members. Two months prior, if the workshop is not filled, the workshop will be opened to other guilds and to the general public at an additional fee. One month prior to the workshop, if not filled, the workshop will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up **AND** paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- Once the workshop is filled, a "waiting" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. If you need to cancel, please do not find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.
- Once you have signed up for a workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you will not receive a refund unless your spot is filled. Please contact **Bette Gove** as soon as you know you can't come and if applicable, the next person on the waiting list will be contacted. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement. Please advise Bette who this person is and their contact information.
