#### **UPCOMING WORKSHOPS AND PROGRAMS**

**Bette Gove** 



AUGUST 21...Workshop – "Mini Mosa-ics"...instructor Cheryl Lynch
This is a fun no sew workshop that imitates the ancient art of mosaics, inspired by Cheryl's trip to Israel. Learn how to create a mosaic picture from small pre-cut pieces of lots of colored fabric, using a technique Cheryl developed to simplify the process. Pick one of the available patterns/kit in class that will finish a 9"x12" project that can be bordered and quilted to your preference at home. Wait list only.

August 22 - Program - "Turning Travel into Treasures"...lecturer Cheryl Lynch About Cheryl...Cheryl made her first quilt out of Marimekko fabric when she was attending graduate school. It took another 17 years to make a second one. Fascinated by the color and texture of fabric, Cheryl discovered she could create art and folk art without knowing how to paint with a brush. The challenge became how to turn her ideas into a quilt. She likes to build one section at a time by putting together the pieces of the puzzle, making the quilt challenging and energizing. This process sometimes necessitates the development of a new technique or use of non-traditional fabric.

September 25, 9am-3pm - Intermediate Machine Quilting - Instructor - Susie Jacobs. The class time will be spent exploring an assortment of designs for use in blocks, borders, and backgrounds. Each pattern will first be drawn on paper and then stitched on fabric. She will cover lots of tips and techniques needed for successful quilting, picking quilt designs to suit your quilt and how a little tweak can change the look of a design. There are only two places left in this class. Cost is \$35.00.

**Susie Jacobs** made her first quilt over 35 years ago and wishes she had kept count on how many quilts she has made since. She took her first machine quilting class 20 years ago and after a shaky start, began to enjoy the time spent creating designs on her quilts. Over the years, she has shared her love of quilting while working in quilt shops and teaching.



Workshop: Wool Embroidery, Monday Oct. 23, 9AM– 3PM. Teacher Cecily Sue Roth. With the kit CS will supply (\$25 day of the workshop) you will be working on one of her designs. She will show you how to do the stitches along with guidance as to what to do where. Because she wants to give everyone lots of personal attention the class size is limited to 10. You will be able to make this project into a pillow, or a wall hanging, or part of a quilt. NO sewing machine needed! *Cost of class is \$25.00*.

# **Workshop Guidelines 2017**

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of quilters (generally between 10 to 20) to learn new patterns and new techniques, to develop deeper threads of friendship and to obtain valued instruction from the guest speaker.

Please follow these **guidelines** when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign up will begin at the monthly guild meeting three or more months prior to the workshop.
- Three months or more prior to the workshop, the sign up will be offered to our guild members. Two months prior, if the workshop is not filled, the workshop will be opened to other guilds and to the general public at an additional fee. One month prior to the workshop, if not filled, the workshop will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up **AND** paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- Once the workshop is filled, a "waiting" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. If you need to cancel, please do not find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.
- Once you have signed up for a workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you will not receive a refund unless your spot is filled. Please contact **Bette Gove** as soon as you know you can't come and if applicable, the next person on the waiting list will be contacted. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement. Please advise Bette who this person is and their contact information.

The president called the meeting to order at 1:00 PM.

Programs (Bette Gove) reported the following:

**August 21 – Mini-Mosaics** This workshop is full.

**September 25 – Susie Jacobs – Machine Quilting for Intermediates** There is one spot left for this workshop.

October – Cecily Sue Roth – Hand Stitching on Wool – One has signed up for this workshop.

**November - Rosemarie Newcomb** is giving a lecture. Topic -TBD

Shannan and Cecily Sue reported all programs for 2018 are ready to go and they will begin publicizing and signing people up for the March workshop in October.

Two members joined at the July meeting making membership 152 at this time.

Treasurer reported:

#### **Charity Report**

July's intake was like Christmas for the charity committee. Fabrics were donated that will be perfect in wheelchair and walker bags (look for them in February). Thank you, Dawn. We received notions and a box of picot-edged satin ribbons for our bears at the February sew-in. Several lap and wheelchair quilts were received that definitely were made from donations and stash. These scrappy quilts are real charmers and brings smiles to the agencies that receive them. The bears have been busy in the both Bedford and Franklin hospitals and emergency rooms. One nurse informed me that in a way that was good news; the kids were coming in with bike and water sport accidents...proof they were playing outside, not sitting inside in front of screens and phones.

So far this year we have delivered 8 baby quilts, 60 pillow pals, 16 lap quilts with 2 pillowcases, 12 fidget quilts, 90 bears, 18 quilts with cases, 10 wheelchair/walker bags and 31 baby bears. Please stop by our table to check out donated fabrics to fill out your stash. As donations come in, we've been assigning the odd buttons, belts, ribbons, zippers, and trims to a storage box dedicated to fidget quilts. Hospice nurses in both counties have expressed interest in our fidget quilts and have chosen quilts with specific patients in mind. Thank you for making this possible.


