

Workshop Guidelines 2017

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of quilters (generally between 10 to 20) to learn new patterns and new techniques, to develop deeper threads of friendship and to obtain valued instruction from the guest speaker.

Please follow these **guidelines** when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign up will begin at the monthly guild meeting three or more months prior to the workshop.
- Three months or more prior to the workshop, the sign up will be offered to our guild members. Two months prior, if the workshop is not filled, the workshop will be opened to other guilds and to the general public at an additional fee. One month prior to the workshop, if not filled, the workshop will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up **AND** paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- Once the workshop is filled, a "waiting" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. If you need to cancel, please do not find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.
- Once you have signed up for a workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you will not receive a refund unless your spot is filled. Please contact **Shannan Maggied or Cecily-Sue Roth** as soon as you know you can't come and if applicable, the next person on the waiting list will be contacted. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement. Please advise Program VPs who this person is and provide his or her contact information.



Lake Quilters Guild Board Meeting January 8, 2017

Present: Mary Hamlin, Jackie Hodgson, Shannan Maggied, Cecily Sue Roth, Linda Walters, Sue Whitney

The president called the meeting to order at 11:00 AM.

There were no changes or additions to the minutes from the November 13th board meeting. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$1,564.06 for December 2017. See treasurer's report for details. Cecily Sue will notify the treasurer of changes to programs expenses. It was noted that all funds collected for 2018 programs and memberships will be credited to 2018 budget. Programs (Shannan Maggied and Cecily Sue Roth) reported the following:

January – Program: Ready, Set, Sew: New Ideas for the New Year! - 4 short presentations by guild members.

February – Charity Sew-In starting at 9 AM

March – Suzzie Schuyler – Half Time, including more masculine quilts – Cost \$35 for members, \$40 for non-members plus book purchase.

Membership for 2018 stands at 118. Sue and Mary went over the volunteers list and made corrections and additions. Mary will contact those positions in question or empty and get back with Sue. Sue informed the board that she has spent \$80 of \$150 budgeted for materials to make and mail the updated LQG pamphlets so she may not be able to produce them this year. Sue will also update the new member packet. Mary and Sue agreed that the attendance/membership report will be given at the end of the monthly business meeting. The board is looking for someone to shadow Sue as VP of membership.

Please get all newsletter articles to Jackie Hodgson ASAP.

Offering hard plastic name tags to interested members was discussed. Local procurement is not reliable. Cecily Sue will investigate having plastic name tags made by an internet company that has the LQG logo on hand.

In Mary's absence, Cecily Sue will preside at the meeting on January 23.

It was noted that the by-laws are three years old. They need to be updated; therefore, a By-Laws Committee needs to be formed.

The board discussed several ideas to get members together more often to get to know each other better. Mary suggested these ideas be presented to the membership at the Charity Sew-In in February. Cecily Sue presented a fundraising idea since the guild is unable to sell small items to raise extra money. The items, a large canvas bag or nylon backpack with embroidered guild logo could be sold to members at the cost of \$20 (backpack) or \$25 (canvas bag). There is an additional cost of \$5 for personalization with name, if desired. Cecily Sue will donate time and any profit she would make on these bags. Her material costs are about \$12.50 per bag. The guild would make \$12.50 on each bag sold. The board agreed. Cecily Sue will discuss this with Ways and Means and will provide samples of each at the January guild meeting.

The board will not meet in February.

The next board meeting is Monday, March 19 at 9:30 AM at the home of Cecily Sue Roth, 80 Edgewater Drive, Moneta.
