
President's Message

Hello Quilting Ladies!



Shannon will present a full-day workshop called, "Bottles and Blooms," where students will learn to create embroidered vintage blue-green bottles with the illusion of Sower stems, add three-dimensional daffodils, and then choose whether to have a hand or machine-quilted background, or maybe even a piece of a vintage cutter quilt. Mon., Aug. 27, 9 am-3pm: Cathy Bogan – "Jelly Roll Race" Workshop

The self-taught quilter, teacher, and owner of Stitch Party Studio in Madison, NC, has taught all levels and ages of quilters at various quilt shops, guilds, summer programs, and retreats in NC, SC and VA since 1998, including seven years at Rock-ingham Community College in Wentworth, NC. Cathy likes to make things fun, and her full-day "Jelly Roll Race" work-shop will be filled with FUN and wonderful prizes! All it takes is one jelly roll to make the 50" x 64" quilt top. You can bring a jelly roll of your own or purchase one that Cathy brings from her shop. For the confident beginner through ad-vanced quilter, this is a quick, fun way to make a quilt top in a day. (\$30Mem./ \$35/Non-Mem.: Max of 20 students). Tues., Aug. 28, 1-3 pm: "Trunk Show" – Cathy will present a varied collection of her beautiful quilts.

LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2018

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest Presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- **One month prior** to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered signed up</u> <u>until your payment is received.</u>
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.)
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILLNOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Please contact <u>Shannan Maggied</u> or <u>Cecily-Sue Roth</u> as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for.** If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give Shannan or Cecily-Sue your replacement's name and contact information.

IT'S ALMOST TIME!

It is less than <u>four weeks</u> until our quilt show!! Wow!! Hardly seems possible. Be sure to finish up those quilts you are putting in the show.

Instructions for turning in your quilts:

We want to thank you ladies for the 166 entries in our quilt show. Now let's make sure we get them finished with a 4"sleeve and a label on the back. ALL entries MUST be brought to the CHURCH on <u>Thursday, April 5 between 9:30 AM and</u> <u>10:00 AM</u>.

PLEASE use the church office entrance door as to not interfere with structural set up. Those setting up bee displays, use this door also.

"Be sure to go over your quilts and remove any pins that might have been left in them."

February Sew-In Report

Thanks to all the ladies who stitched, clipped, turned, stuffed and stitched closed 158 adorable bears last month. That is not all...we now have 97 of an estimated 220 Christmas stockings ready for Step to fill for their pre-school youngsters early next December. We have found homes for a large stash of donated minkie fabric. Marnie's donated fabric is fast disappearing into quilts and now placemats for Good Neighbors' new home. Quilters certainly know how to feather a nest!

Some of you have taken on fidget quilts and I love the idea that you are taking them to private homes, churches, and nursing homes all around our Bedford and Franklin Counties. We have special needs children who use fidget quilts in church and other public gatherings, as well as neighbors who are being cared for in their homes by family. Thank you so much for thinking of them. For those of you who make bears during one of your bee meetings, we have plenty of Polyfil for stuffing. Ask at any guild meeting before you start stuffing. We have two 10 pound boxes (plus a couple of bags) of Polyfil. Just remember that once you open the Polyfil box, the stuffing creeps out slowly and is difficult to stuff back in. Oh, and it makes a sighing sound that can be very spooky if you sew late into the night or are up by yourself sewing before sunrise. Fair warning.

MEMBERSHIP (Sue)




2018 Challenge News from River Queen Bee




