

LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2018

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest Presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. **You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.**
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.)
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILLNOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Please contact <u>Shannan Maggied</u> or <u>Cecily-Sue Roth</u> as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for.** If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give Shannan or Cecily-Sue your replacement's name and contact information.

LQG BOARD MINUTES AUGUST 13, 2018

Present: Sandra Ferguson, Mary Hamlin, Jackie Hodgson, Shannan Maggied (joined the meeting remotely), Joyce Noell, Cecily-Sue Roth, Linda Walters, Sue Whitney.

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

MEMBERSHIP

Sue contacted about 40 members who have not renewed. Over 25% were very happy to hear from the guild and glad to be remembered. The mixer by birthdays at July's guild meeting was a success.

TREASURER'S REPORT: See newsletter

Joyce needs a decision on choices for charity contributions so that she can write checks before December 31, 2018. Sue recalled that many members did not know about the charities listed on last year's ballot. Mary will see that information about each charity is listed on the ballot to be distributed to membership this year.

Concern #1: A review of records is not an audit. We have had reviews of records for the past several years but not an audit. The LQG books need to be audited. Several suggestions for auditors were made. Cost should be around \$250.

Concern #2: Joyce read a letter dated 1/31/12 from IRS concerning the LQG tax status. The board also reviewed documents from board members' meetings with CPA, Eric Faber and Tax Attorney, Ted E. Troland. After reviewing these documents, a lengthy discussion of the guild tax status followed.

The board decided to proceed as follows:

A meeting was set up with Mr. Faber to discuss compiling a list of the pros and cons of changing tax status. This list will be distributed to all members for perusal before any action is taken by the guild membership.

Friendship Bee

Christmas Luncheon at Waterfront Country Club was the birthplace of the Friendship Bee. Eight "non-bee" members met around a table and discussed how people came together to form a bee. Some were formed by neighbors, others by a certain type of quilting or needlework.

By March of 2009, three of us (with no bee in our neighborhood) met for lunch at Gloria Thar's very handicap accessible house. One was a hand quilter and recovering from gastric by-pass, the accomplished knitter/novice quilter was recovering from knee surgery, and the one with over 50 years of quilting/needlework was facing foot surgery and weeks on crutches.

Over lunch we chose the name Friendship. Until Gloria moved to South Carolina the bee met once a month at her house. We added only as many members as her great room would hold. Since her move, we've had a calendar making session at the end of each year and signed up for meetings in each members' house.

We meet the first and third Mondays. Some meetings are "shop hops", quilt shows, or art exhibitions. We attend retreats in the fall and spring. Our Friendship Bee has become "sisters" that we have chosen. We all love new tools and new fabric. One new member even showed us what to do with the many phone books that clog our mailboxes...and thus we sew merrily along our individual ways together, always stopping for lunch.

Every charity quilt goes to a nursing home, women's shelter, CASA, Hospice, Social Services foster care or the Perinatal Center. Quilts destined for CASA and domestic violence shelters are placed within a coordinating pillowcase. Two bright black/white and red quilts that were perfect for CASA or shelters had no real match so they were in my car until I could find them each pillowcase fabric. Mission accomplished: fabric found and placed with quilts, ready for the sewing machine.

Just before supper Wednesday, a call came from a friend who completed her third chemo treatment earlier and was now experiencing a reaction. She was told to get to Roanoke where an oncologist would be "on call". Tossing my yoga gear into the trunk, I picked up my friend and her husband (poor night vision) and started out. She was freezing as well as itching while we were almost drowning in heat and humidity. From the back seat, her husband asked which fleeced-lined quilt could she use. Charity quilt to the rescue. Just before dawn, my friend was released from the warmth of heated blankets to the warmth of one of our charity quilts. She is getting a red fleece chemo cap instead of a pillowcase.
