LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered</u> <u>signed up until your payment is received.</u>
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILLNOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Please contact **Veronica Church <u>vchurchlqg@gmail.com</u>** as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for.** If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give **Veronica** your replacement's name and contact information.

New Basic Quilting Class

A new class will begin in January, taking place during the block of the Month time, noon to 12:45. We will cover tools, color, fabric, rotary cutting, accurate seaming, pressing, piecing, half square triangles, flying geese and many other topics.

If you are a beginner or just want to hone your skills, sign up to express your interest with Sue



Whitney at the sign in table. We will limit the enrollment, so we can give you individual attention. Those who sign up early will get first choice of attending.

Currently we plan six sessions, but we can plan more if the need arises to cover putting together your quilt top, borders, preparing for quilting and binding. We plan to charge approximately \$10 (one time charge) to cover the costs of copying handouts.

Thanks to many fabric and notion donations, as well as our own "in-house" quilting experts, we have some new sew-in projects this year. Instead of **throw away** scraps, we will **sew away** scraps into scrappy charity quilts. One former member and one current member have made generous donations as they have been down-sizing. They had more project boxes than they could complete in their lifetime, so we are the inheritors of their stashes. Fret not if the weather won't cooperate. All of these sets of fabric are being Zip-Lock bagged before we stack them into crates and bins. Some previous Charity chairpersons called such kits 'Opportunity quilts'. One small church in North Carolina calls quilts made of donated fabric by a church quilt group '**prayer quilts**'. Before sending the finished quilts to nursing homes or pediatric hospitals, they pray for the recipients of their quilts. Please remember to **pack a lunch or snack**. February is Lake Quilters birthday month and we celebrate with cake and soft drinks at the end of our lunch break. Snow, snow, stay away. All the quilters want to play!

LQG BOARD MEETING MINUTES – January 15, 2019

ATTENDEES:

Meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m. by President Mary Hamlin

<u> Membership Report – Sue Whitney</u>

90 current paid members
3 charter members
2 paid advertisers
13 total have signed up for Sandra Ferguson's Beginner Class (1 still unpaid)

<u> Treasurer's Report – Joyce Noell (absent)</u>

Veronica read us Joyce's email where she requested that the Guild stop using Square for invoicing of expenses. After discussion (focused on the ease for members of using credit cards over checks/cash), Sue Whitney moved that we continue to use Square in 2019. That was seconded by Veronica Church and all voted 'yes'.

<u> Program Report – Veronica Church</u>

Program is built out for the entire year. Focus will be on (1) creating more opportunities for member involvement and interaction and (2) supplementing externally driven workshops with more in-house driven activities.

Veronica committed to obtaining samples in advance of external workshops so that those samples can be displayed at Guild meetings (to generate interest and excitement).

Old Business – All

Sue Whitney distributed updated copies of the LQG By-Laws and reviewed the key changes. Next By-Law review will be in 2021, where two items will be revisited: (1) the benefit of having 'Elect' (in-waiting) Board positions and (2) the benefit of moving the holiday party coordination from the Hospitality Committee to the Special Events Committee.

Still need Committee Chairs for: 'Ways & Means' & 'Special Events' (which includes Retreats)

The Library Committee needs more focus on book reviews at Guild meetings.

Need a Summary Sheet on the specifics of the Guild being confirmed as a 501(c) 7 non-profit organization. Veronica agreed to contact Eric to obtain this. Once we have this summary, all Board members will receive a copy for future reference.

<u>New Business – All</u>

Sue Wilson suggested we consider creating a "buddy" system – where new Guild members are paired up with existing members for purposes of assimilation and helping the new member feel more welcome and included. All agreed this is a great idea and Mary asked Sue Whitney to add this as an area of focus to this year's Membership agenda.
