

LOG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- Two months prior to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT
 receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

BOOK REVIEWS

LQG November 2019 Book Reviews:

The book reviews for November are all about different quilt-at-you-go techniques


Cut, Sew, Quilt as You Go by Leisure Arts



This book is all about how to make rag lap quilts and throws. Rag quilts are characterized by ragged exposed seams that create a soft, fluffy and charming look when washed. The beauty of rag quilting is that you can cut, sew and quilt one section at a time. Often rag quilts can be whipped up over a weekend or a few nights. The book gives clear directions on how to make frayed -edge patchwork and simple machine Applique. Photos and instructions for several quilts, along with Applique patterns are included.

Cotton Theory Quilting by Betty Cotton

The traditional way of putting together a quilt is to assemble the top first. Quilters tend to enjoy traditional quilting because they can see their design come together when the top is finished. The difficulty with that approach is the size of the final quilt sandwich, especially with a larger sized quilt. Cotton Theory Quilting solved that problem by devising a way to quilt the top, the batting and the backing one section at a time. After the quilting of the different sections are complete, the sections are then assembled using specified sewing, folding and top -stitching techniques. All of these techniques are thoroughly demonstrated in the book. One nice byproduct of the Cotton theory of quilting is that most of the quilts that are produced are completely reversible. Several quilting projects are highlighted along with photos and directions.


