

LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- Two months prior to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Quilt Your Favorite Photos by Betty Alofs

This guide is all about the process of transforming much loved photos into treasured quilts. It covers how to make patterns with a numbering sys-Favorite Photos tem, how to chose fabrics and what techniques to use to create a realistic look. Several pictures of the author's favorite photo guilts are featured. Included in the book are 10 projects with full size patterns.

<u>Free-Motion Machine Quilting 1-2-3</u> by Lori Kennedy

There are more than 100 pages of quilting motifs with 400 close up pictures showing the step-by step process for each design. The book starts with an explanation of what equipment is needed for successful free motion quilting and which stitching patterns are helpful for beginners. This handy spiral bound edition has earned over 75 five star ratings on Amazon.

INFORMAL UFO LONG WEEKEND


DON'T MISS THIS




