

Tues, April 23, 9am-3pm: Quilts of Valor block making.

Please bring any red, white, cream and blue fabrics cut to make simple blocks; log cabin, string quilts, nine patch, four patch, whatever you want to sew. All finished blocks should be 12.5". Please pick appropriate fabric, no juvenile patterns. Please do not use a flag pattern that resembles a casket flag. If you would like to finish a quilt, size requirement is 60"x80". Use cotton low loft batting. There will be more information at the workshop. They will be shipped to the Quilts of Valor Foundation. Please join us in honoring service men & women!!!

Tues, May 28, 9:00am-12pm: Jill Jensen will teach 'Introduction to Block Carving and Printing on Fabric'.

LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered</u> signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Please contact **Veronica Church** <u>vchurchlqg@gmail.com</u> as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for.** If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give **Veronica** your replacement's name and contact information.



BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantle

Two wonderful books that are available in our library:


<u>Simple Strategies for Block-Swap Quilts by Lynn Roddy Brown</u>



The author explains how to assemble a scrap quilt by acquiring blocks through trade. The advantages of making a quilt this way is that it takes less effort and it results in a greater variety of fabrics. Trades resulting in an attractive quilt usually have a unifying element such as color, fabric or values. Some trading groups use strict standards for their trading blocks and others may have looser standards. Either way, a wonderful quilt may result, reflecting the friendships and memories behind it. This book is full of guidelines and instructions along with beautiful photos of block-swap quilts.

<u>Creating Celebration Quilts by Cyndi Souder</u>

Cyndi starts out by talking about her love for celebration quilts and then describes how she plans and designs them. She suggests that the best way to plan a project is by filling out her celebration worksheet which narrows down the purpose of the quilt (what or who is being celebrated?), how it is to be utilized and what memorabilia and colors should be incorporated. The next section of the book shows photographs of the lovely celebration quilts Cyndi has made along with step by step instructions and photos of how each project was brought to fruition. The latter part of book describes how to build a celebration toolbox. The



purpose of the toolbox is to keep a record of our skills, experiences and knowledge we have built over a lifetime that will help in our quilting endeavors.

<u>Charity Report</u>

We are still distributing bears and quilts. We took in bags of bears last month, as well as pillow cases and lap quilts. Thanks so <u>beary</u> much. Watch for the following patterns with kits made of donated fabrics and notions at the <u>April guild meeting</u>: wheelchair bags (2 kinds), walker bags, bibs (2 kinds), Bags of Hope, bears, tote bags, Christmas stockings, and perhaps a surprise or two! One adorable donation arrived on our table that charmed everyone who saw it. There will be a pattern for it

Now I will share a short story of the travels of donated fabric to and from our guild. Late 2017 or early 2018, Sue Wilson brought in a very large box stuffed with pieces of Minkie fleece that a friend had sent to her. Other members dropped of bags of scrap fleece and flannel. The flannel went to bear makers. The fleece and minkie went home with me to be put through the dryer before being sorted and placed on our donation table. Minkie with raw edges and I cannot co-exist. Cecily-Sue Roth saw the big bag of unclaimed minkie at the end of our next guild meeting and asked if she could use it to make monsters for a hospital in Freder-icksburg. Of course she could but I could not imagine what she was talking about. <u>Monsters?</u> After our March meeting last month, Cecily-Sue showed me pictures of the monsters she and an embroidery group



made here at the Lake. She delivered the monsters to the Trauma unit at the hospital in Fredericksburg for children (and some adults) facing surgery. They were the cutest, brightest, most squeezable little monsters I have ever seen!




