

#### LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

**LQG Workshops** are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered</u> signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.


# **BOOK REVIEWS**

#### How to make beautiful and interesting quilts from pre-cuts


#### <u>StrataVarious Quilts by Barbara Persing and Mary Hoover</u>



A strata designed quilt is characterized by differing sizes of fabric sewn together in sections, which are then pieced together in a random fashion. The more fabrics used the better. Large print fabrics are encouraged because they add interesting depth and dimension. The first step in preparing a strata quilt is the sorting of a fabric stash by color since that is the basis of how the quilt is planned. The many shades, tones and textures of the fabrics will add to the overall quilt design. Nine fabulous, colorful strata quilts are featured, along with complete instructions, suggestions, photos and some applique patterns. The only additional equipment that may be needed, other than typical quilting supplies, would be specific sized rulers.

#### <u>Jelly Roll Quilts & More by Kimberly Enma (from the American Quilter's Society)</u>

Quilting has become faster, easier and more accurate in the past few years due new techniques and a number of great new products. One new product is the precise precut fabrics packs that are available in a wide array of colors and sizes. Kimberly contends that if you learn the three basic quilting techniques from the book- the four-patch unit, the flying geese unit and the half -square unit- you can make an almost limitless number of more complicated quilt blocks from jelly rolls or other precut packs. Throughout the book Kimberly adds many wonderful quilting tips including: throw away a machine needle after 8 hours of sewing (she puts them in old dental floss containers), have your machine serviced the same time once a year (to help you remember) AND, make your own jelly roll strips as a way to put a dent in your stash and organize a "strip swap" with friends or fellow guild members.


# Weather Cancellations
