

LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- Two months prior to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Please contact **Veronica Church vchurchlqg@gmail.com** (540) 493-8058 as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for.** If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give **Veronica** your replacement's name and contact information.




BOOK REVIEWS


Welcome Home (New Edition) by Kaffe Fassett



Kaffe Fassett, the author of Welcome Home, is an American artist, well known for his beautiful and colorful work in painting, fabric, patchwork quilting, needlework, knitting and mosaic. His work was once the subject of a one man show at the Victoria and Albert Museum in London. In Welcome Home, Kaffe highlights items in his home such as old textiles, china pots, tin boxes and beaded bags that have inspired many of his design ideas. One section of the book contains exclusive photographs of Kaffe's one man exhibition on fabric design in the Minneapolis Institute of Art. Welcome Home also includes directions for a number of home projects, such as quilts and rugs, that all reflect Kaffe's unique sense of color and design. All projects have directions and patterns.

Improv Paper Piercing by Amy Friend

Amy Friend shows how to create improvised blocks through a new technique-based approach that incorporates creative design with technical precision. She accomplishes this through the use of ten guided exercises that demonstrate how to design unique improvised paper piercing patterns. Ultimately, these techniques result in a one-of-a-kind quilt of repeated blocks. There are complete instructions in the book along with templates for ten beautiful quilts. The author also makes a point to encourage the reader to design their own quilt by utilizing the techniques demonstrated in the book.

Material Girls "Retreat"

The noun definition of Retreat is an "act of moving back or withdrawing" and that's just about what we do when we leave for our annual January retreat in Fredericksburg, VA. We are withdrawing from our daily routines and obligations at home, retreating to a place where we can freely do what we all love to do – sit and quilt ALL DAY long with no interruptions. So good for the soul, at least for this group of 8 friends who love to quilt together! We have been doing this week long retreat for 15 years! We haven't missed a year. We began this adventure at a condo at Masssanutten Resort, then rented a house for a couple of years in the same area. Sharon's daughter has a vacation home on the Potomac River in the Stafford, VA area and we enjoyed one year there. After that our group expanded and we needed a larger home. Janie found us a great house to rent at Lake of the Woods near Fredericksburg. After a couple of years there, we found an even better location at Lake of the Woods and have been there for nine years! There is loads of space and the home is on a lake so we feel right at home! Sadly 2020 will be our last year there, the owners are putting that home on the market sometime next year. It should be about a 4 hour drive but we always stop at the Cottonwood Quilt Shop in Charlottesville and then lunch before heading to the house thus increasing the time it actually takes to get there!

We all seem to have a lot of Unfinished Projects to work on or new projects we would like to begin. We find we are even more productive if we have all of our projects cut out ahead of time. We often have charity projects we are able to put together during this group sew time. We have made quilts for the Discovery Shop, Alzheimer Association, SML Good Neighbors to name a few. We also made over 50 pillowcases for Chemo patients in hospitals.

Occasionally we do a group project. The one that generated a lot of very pretty quilts was the Friendship Triangle exchange from Edyta Sitar's book "Friendship Triangles". We had hundreds of half square triangles we each made, dumped on the table and then took out as many as we each put in the pile. Such fun. This year we each made about 20 strip sets (measuring about 11"x22") from Kaffe Fasset fabrics and exchanged them at retreat. The challenge is to make a quilt of some sort and our efforts will be revealed at our 2020 retreat.

We take turns preparing dinner, often working in teams of two. We have had excellent dinners with delicious desserts and always look forward to a few standards. Sharon does a wonderful turkey breast in the crockpot, Cindy has a wonderful pasta sauce we often try to get her to make. Mary Stuart makes us wonderful shortbread cookies. While delicious, we do try keep the food simple. We like to keep kitchen time down to a minimum. With leftovers we can always count on Marcia to come up with a delicious soup for future lunches!! Adult beverages seem to have declined as we have aged but they still take up plenty of room in the bar area. Breakfast and lunch are always an "on your own" event. We have been very lucky to have a Food Lion right across the street! We always have a shopping day in the middle of the week and visit the wonderful Crazy Cousins quilt shop not too far from our house and we enjoy lunch out and some make a trip to the local COSCO

We look forward to many more annual retreats!



Weather Cancellations




















