


LOG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- Two months prior to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.





Publicity Corner - January Janet L Webster

Hello Quilters! Welcome to the **Publicity Corner** – a new column that we will share information about a variety of local and national quilting events as well as information about newsletters and associations dedicated to quilting. There is a lot to share, so I'll offer bits of info each month.

This month I wanted to share some specifics about the <u>Virginia Consortium of Quilters</u> (<u>VCQ</u>). VCQ is open to everyone interested in quilting. Members come from surrounding states as well as Virginia. VCQ is a state-wide organization that meets three to four times a year in various parts of the state. In even years they have a 4-day Celebration of Quilting with classes and good fun. <u>This year the 4-day celebration is April 23-26 at SML4H Center!</u> Listed below are some highlights about VCQ - check out <u>www.vcq.org</u> for more information.

How To Join

Annual membership is \$25. Dues are for the calendar year: January 1 through December 31. There are no pro-rated dues. Mailing instructions are included on the membership forms which are available on the website.

Newsletter

VCQ publishes a newsletter about six weeks prior to each quarterly meeting. It contains workshop information for the meeting as well as other VCQ informational updates. Issues are available on the website.

<u>Celebration – this year at Smith Mountain Lake April 23-26, 2020, at SML 4H Center</u>

Every two years, the years ending with even numbers (2014, 2016, 2018, 2020), the VCQ has a grand weekend of quilting, eating, and just plain fun! Workshops are available with teachers from across the country. Or, you can choose to sew on your own in the 'Come Quilt with Me' room. The workshops are wonderful, the food is wonderful, and the friendships you make and re-establish each time, are priceless.

Thinking of You

VCQ has a "Thinking of You" block you can use to let members know you are thinking of them. Use it in time of illness, sorrow, to extend congratulations, or just to say "I'm thinking of you." The pattern is available on the website and is taken from an old friendship block. The block is 4" in size and fits perfectly inside a card.

Don't Forget - Mark Your Calendars – It's our <u>30th Anniversary</u>, and we're having a major celebration on Tuesday, February 25. Hope to see you there.

Let me leave you this month with an interesting finding. <u>Did You Know?</u> A study in the Journal of the American Medical Association shows evidence that quilt making can improve blood pressure, respiration, and heart rate. (American Quilter's Society December 2019 Magazine)








BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantel


Scraps & Shirttails: Reuse, Re-purpose, Recycle! The Art of Quilting Green by Bonnie K. Hunter



The author wasn't sure how to deal with her burgeoning stash of fabric so she decided to study antique quilting to get some ideas. She found that the type of quilt she was often drawn to was the utility quilt, usually stitched with large, easy-to-piece blocks made of the lesser worn parts of old clothing. She started putting together her own utility quilts using a combination of her stash fabric along with fabric from old clothing. The author discovered that she got additional satisfaction out of recycling clothing fabric that would normally be thrown away. Included in the book are instructions on how to get the most fabric out of a shirt, what materials are available as "green batting", and how to best organize your stash to optimize quilting time. Twelve utility style quilt patterns are included in the book along with a pattern for a shopping bag.

Quilt-As You-Go Made Modern by Jera Brandvig

Jera was attracted to this quilt-as-you-go method because she only had time to quilt late at night, after her son went to bed, and she was too tired to worry about being precise with measurement and rotary cutting. She found that working with small and manageable blocks versus the large quilt sandwich allowed for more flexibility and creativity. As a mom always on the go, it was easier to stop and start when working with smaller pieces than an entire quilt. This technique works well for the beginner as well as the more experienced quilter. With this method, the quilt top is pieced directly on top of blocks of batting. After the top and batting pieces are assembled and stitched together, the backing fabric and the binding have to be completed. Instructions are given for necessary supplies along with basic quilting techniques. Detailed directions are included for a number of colorful projects.

January Charity Report

We have all heard the saying "Timing is everything." When making the delivery of Christmas stockings to STEP, I was greeted by two adults that I had not seen before. They were so thrilled to see such adorable, handmade stockings, all different. I was (sort of) prepared to answer their standard question: "What is the value or market price of each donated item?" The Craft Show circuit in Southside Virginia, Piedmont and Highland Craft Fairs in North Carolina have suggested values, but I have not been actively following the fairs, nor been a member of these guilds for many years. A friend who has remained active brought me up to date this fall, so I was ready to set an average value

. The woman signing our distribution form sews and quilts, so she knows that we spend time making stockings and quilts with donated fabric. She asked me if I had time for her to give us some forms for documenting time spent making "in kind" donations. Both women were very helpful, suggesting ways we could easily record our time spent making quilts, bears, or stockings. Charitable organizations - like STEP - use donated "in kind" hours when applying for grants. With their help, we will donate stockings and "in kind" hours next year. The stockings were delightful this year. Too bad that I didn't record the oohs and aahs as the stockings were counted and taken from the "sacks".

Members are: Nancy Corp, Sharon Cullen, Janet Fogel, Bette Gove, Patti Lively, Connie



Meetings are in the Moneta library (Bedford City.) on the third Tues-day of each month at 1:00. We are currently full.


