LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered</u> <u>signed up until your payment is received.</u>
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantel

Loose Change: Quilts from Nickels, Dimes, and Fat Quarters by That Patchwork Place



Nickels, Dimes and Quarters refers to 5", 10" and fat quarters of fabric. Loose Change is unique in that it showcases twelve projects that use a combination of nickels, dimes and quarters in a number of different ways. Due to the flexibility of fabric sizes, the projects in <u>Loose Change</u> lend themselves to fabric swaps with friends and fellow quilters. The instructions for each project include a designation of experience level from beginner to advanced. A number of different techniques are used including straight seam piecing, paper piecing, optional Appliqué and optional embroidery. A general rule of thumb is the wider the variety of fabrics used, the scrappier the look of the quilt project

Jelly Roll Quilts by Pam and Nicky Lintott

Jelly Roll Quilts has over 400 Amazon reviews averaging 4.7 out of 5 stars! A jelly roll is a roll of 40 fabrics cut into 2 ½" strips that are color coordinated and rolled up to a solid disc tied with a ribbon. Many quilters prefer working with precut fabric such as jelly rolls because it saves a great deal of time and effort. Working with precut fabric can also cut down on leftover fabric scraps. Jelly Roll Quilts gives complete instructions on how to make 15 quilts of varying sizes and levels of difficulty. It must be noted that one of the best things about putting together a jelly roll quilt is that it can often be assembled in only one weekend

Painted and quilted fabric book. 16 whole cloth paintings bound together, with eight double sided and quilted pages in all.

Gretchen is my only child, so when she was born, it was a huge event and felt like a miracle. Now that she has a five year old daughter, it felt really good to create a book of the story of Gretchen's life up to age 15. Not only can Eva read and see what her mother's life was like as a child, but Gretchen can understand her early life a bit more from my point of view.

I began the book with me being pregnant, going through Gretchen's birth. The stories move through her preschool days and ballet classes, up through when she and I went to Oregon on the Greyhound Bus. I tell of her adventures with her girlfriends. One of my favorite pages is of her playing Chutes and Ladders with my mother, Gretchen's Panny.

The front cover is of Gretchen's 10th birthday, when Jimmy and I gave her the vintage Hey, Diddle Diddle cookie jar, filled with her favorite cookies: Nabisco Mystic Mints. (I didn't have any old photos with me at the class, but I had vivid memories, so I just drew and hoped my Gretchen faces would look like her. It was probably better that way, as I just drew and didn't have any image studying to slow me down.) I added some roses around her and her cookie jar, to show how sweet and loving that day was.

I enjoyed making this book, more than I could have imagined. The processes are the same ones I use in making my art quilts, which are really sewn up paintings. And somehow, holding the little paintings in my hands in this bound form, the story feels more intimate than it would in a paper version of a book.

Charity Report February Sew-In

Care bears, lap quilts, and baby quilts have been our Charity focus over the years as we carry out our mission to "comfort a child". On Tuesday, February 25th, at 9:00 am the Lake Quilters will start by stuffing and sewing up our 2020 batch of bears. For those who plan to machine stitch bears before stuffing, bring your machine with neutral thread. Those who plan to sew up the stuffed bears, please bring your favorite hand-sewing needle, neutral thread, thimble and snips. As usual, there will be extra thread and snips provided, along with stuffing aids and band-aids.

For each Bee, there will be a packet containing a pattern (with instructions) for each of our most requested donations - Christmas Stockings* -Walker Bags* - Wheelchair Bags* - Small Wheelchair/Bedrail Bag* - Bears - Pillow cases - Fidget quilts. Also included will be patterns for Bibs (2 kinds), Bags of Hope*, simple lap quilts, Wheelchair Lap Quilts (with handwarmers). For those of you not in a bee, there will be extra patterns for you and a sewing buddy. Thanks to generous fabric donations, there will be fabric (and notions) available for patterns with an *. We have plastic storage bags for those who wish to make a kit (pattern plus fabric) to take home. There will be a sample of each charity project for reference or inspiration.

If you are not into sewing, stuffing, or hand-stitching to finish bears, you may want to bring your machine with neutral thread, pick up one of the donated fabric packs with a simple lap quilt pattern, and make a quilt top before lunch. Too tired to pack up your machine and haul it to the Guild meeting? Help us put donated fabric, notions, and patterns into kits to be used for charity this year. Fabric and patterns, cutting mats, rotary cutters, and plastic storage bags will be provided. Until then, stay warm and happy quilting. Questions?
