In the meantime, we have time to quilt, start spring cleaning, clean up the garden and generally become home bodies. Above all else, stay safe.





LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered</u> <u>signed up until your payment is received.</u>
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

Please contact **Veronica Church** <u>vchurchlqg@gmail.com</u> (540) 493-8058 as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for.** If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. Day 2 will continue the dyeing processes as well as starting on the layout of a unique fiber art piece. Wool bead, boro stitching and more will be demonstrated. Two full days of creativity playtime await!!



BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantel


Shape by Shape: Free-Motion Quilting by Angela Walters




There are a number of free motion quilting books on the market that explain how to free motion quilt common free motion quilt patterns. This book goes the extra step of showing the best space in which to use the free motion patterns. <u>Shape by Shape</u> is broken into three different sections: blocks, borders and background (or negative) space. The author explains how to quilt seventy different free motion patterns and suggests which particular geometric shapes, such as circle, square or rectangle, would work best for different patterns. There are a number of full page quilt photos and close-up pictures of the details of stitch designs. There are over 450 reviews of <u>Shape by Shape</u> on Amazon, averaging 4.8 out of 5 stars.

Foolproof Machine Quilting by Mary Mashuta

The author, Mary, is a professional who teaches machine quilting through the use of the walking foot with the feed dogs up. In her book she teaches the basics using detailed instructions and pictures of multiple steps. Mary includes a number of unique ideas and practical tips she has learned along the way. She also gives instructions on how to make your own design templates by folding paper and cutting sample shapes and then transferring them to freezer or self adhesive paper. Her way of transferring the design pattern onto the fabric leaves no tell tale markings on the quilt. In addition, Mary writes about the use of different weight threads on the quilt top and how that changes the over all look of the quilt.

Material Girls 2020

Apparently, we like challenges. We have had a variety of them over the years. One year we gave each other black and white fat quarters for our birthdays and the challenge was to make something with them and share with the group a year later. Another time we had given each other fat quarters of bee fabric, again, we had a year to make something. One year we made a gazillion half square triangles that we exchanged and then made in to some sort of quilt. We all participated in these challenges and the big reveals were at our annual quilt retreat in January. Fun was had by all and the items we made were outstanding, at least we thought so!! Last year we decided on yet another challenge. This time we would make strip sets of Kaffe fabrics (a very colorful and bold line of fabric), we cut strips varying in width from 2 inches down to $1 \frac{1}{2}^{n}$. When sewn together, these strip sets would measure around $9-11^{n}x 22^{n}$. We then exchanged strip sets at the 2019 January retreat. Most of us made 20 strip sets. If we put in 20 strip sets, we took out 20. Our big reveal was at the 2020 January retreat and many of them are on display at this month's guild meeting. Our challenge didn't really have any rules, just make a quilt of some sort. Very interesting how some of us used black as a background and some chose a lighter background. We were thrilled with everyone's effort.

One of our most important yearly events is our week long quilt retreat. We have done this for 15 years and have not missed a year. The past ten were at a lake house at Lake of the Woods in the Fredericksburg area. We just love being able to quilt all day – no worries except to wonder when we will run out of bobbin thread. We each take a turn making dinner for the group. We have excellent meals that take very little effort. We find that we sew all day and many of us extend sewing time into the evening. At the end of the week, we display all of what we have accomplished during the week and are always amazed at our output. It definitely ranks high on the fun-o-meter!! Sadly, the home owners are planning on selling our retreat house and according to them we are the best renters they ever had! Of course, we are quilters, we leave gifts and clean up our messes! We do have a place for next January, we'll be heading to Lake Gaston and will be supporting the local economy of North Carolina.

SMAC / Chamber of Commerce Membership

We discussed the options of becoming members of the Chamber and the SMAC (Smith Mountain Arts Council) and it was decided that the latter organization made the most sense (based on cost and mission).

Kate Holdgreve contacted Sue Whitney about a quilt that was found in our church closet. It was donated in 1992 by Susan Burch (who may have done the piecing) and it was signed by guild members from that time. Sue Whitney is on point for the next steps to have it displayed and signed at our upcoming Quilt Show.


out on our exciting activities. If you have moved out of the area, or are otherwise not going to be renewing for 2020, please advise me by email. Thank you and keep on stitching.

Since our Sew-In on our 30th birthday, I've been preparing this year's bears to go out into the world more carefully than in years past. I had noticed libraries and schools removing stuffed toys to be sanitized when faced with higher absentee counts from influenza in February. In addition to checking each bear for strong stitching to hold in stuffing, searching for stray pins (none were found this year), I finally sent them

through a sanitizing dryer cycle in small batches before packing them in plastic bags for delivery to emergency rooms, domestic shelters, and the Perinatal Center. A volunteer at Bedford Hospital asked us last summer to consider donating "warm, fuzzy" bears to the nursing home there. The darker, fleecy bears that we have received are going to the seniors after they have been properly sent through a sanitizing cycle.
