

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have signed up AND paid can attend the Workshop. <u>You are not considered</u> signed up until your payment is received.
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.



BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantel


Quilt with Tula & Angela




Tula Pink, with her knowledge of color and style and Angela Walters, with her expertise in fabric and design, collaborated on putting together this start-to-finish guide to piecing and quilting. The 17 quilt patterns and 47 quilting motifs featured in the book are all reflections of the author's unique talents in pairing color with style. Tula believes that it's important to view color from a scientific standpoint, however, the best way to choose colors for a project is often by our emotional reaction to them. Angela contends that when we think about what design we may use for our quilt top we must first consider our taste and skill level, along with the overall purpose of the end product. Each chapter features one design shape with one color family in quilts of varying sizes.

Virginia Quilt Museum by Joan Knight

The Virginia Quilt Museum, located in Harrisonburg, Virginia, opened in 1995. At that time there were only 15 quilts. Now, because of many generous donations, the museum has so many quilts that it offers three floors of rotating exhibits. The purpose of the museum is to showcase the beauty and cultural heritage of Virginia heirloom quilts, along with some contemporary and art quilts. The book describes the origins of the museum and highlights a number of quilts of varying styles. Accompanying each quilt is an historical perspective, the date it was made, along with a description of the quilter, what fabrics it's made of, what techniques were used and who donated it.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the museum events have been cancelled or rescheduled. After enough Pineapple Pieces are collected, <u>Pineapple Fabrics</u> will sew them together as a quilt to be donated to Brenner Children's Hospital to contribute and give back.

Brenner Children's Hospital is an internationally renowned hospital that specializes in pediatric medicine, and they are located in North Carolina. Giving to the children at Brenner Children's Hospital just makes sense. What a better way to make a child feel special & loved than gifting them with a quilt handmade especially for them.


