




LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- Three or more months prior to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- Two months prior to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- One month prior to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. **You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.**
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. (If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.

So......Come on girls, give it some thought & get your creative writing juices flowing. I'm looking forward to seeing all the interesting articles that will be coming my way in 2020.








BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantel

Terrific T—Shirt Quilts compiled by Karen M. Burns



It's quite likely that your son, daughter or spouse has a number of old, soft, cotton t-shirts laying around that they no longer wear. Sewing those t-shirts into a lovely quilt is a great way to recycle old clothing and to preserve some wonderful memories. This book is filled with tips on how to make that project work, such as how to stabilize the stretchy t-shirt fabric, what kind of needle to use, how to design the layout, and how to sew the knit fabric pieces together. Instructions and photos of several fabulous t-shirts quilts are showcased throughout the book. Some examples are quilts made of knit baby clothes and receiving blankets, a pink-themed quilt made out of t-shirts from a young girl, several college and sports themed quilts and a quilt made out of travel themed t-shirts.

<u>Joyful Stitchery by Laura Wasilowski</u>



Embroidery is a wonderful craft that is inexpensive, requires few tools, is portable and is easy to learn. The art of embroidery, or hand stitchery, can change a plain, nondescript piece of fabric into a bright, 3-dimensional and stunning scene. The author explains what materials and tools are needed to make the wonderful designs shown in the book. She also gives step-by-step instructions for a variety of embroidery stitches and designs. Six projects with full instructions are included. As a final note, the author stresses that one of the joys of free-form embroidery is that it is not an art that must be followed in a precise and exacting manner. Often the best results occur when the colors, the patterns and the stitch designs are played with and expanded upon.

Charity Report

Linda Brown contacted me about a request for fidget quilts on Facebook Sunday. Did we have any? Of course we had some, so she made contact on Monday and set up a meeting on Tuesday morning in the Public Library parking lot. I brought six fidget quilts and ten bears (back-up, just in case). Linda and I met the Carilion Hospice (FMH) Volunteer Coordinator, masked and socially distanced. You should have seen how pleased she was with the fidget quilts. Conversation turned to quilt needs. There is a need for feminine lap quilts. Yes, we have just what is needed. Our contact took the fidget quilts to the Hospice office, went to a lunch meeting and then came to my house where I had quilts she did not know she needed. Eleven wheelchair quilts she had no idea she needed, four feminine and four masculine lap quilts, and six small, lighter weight lap quilts were packaged and labeled, waiting for her on my front porch. To people who are not quilters or who are just taking up quilting, your quilts are so beautiful. Sometimes, they are breath-taking. And they mean so much to the Hospice patients and their families

and care givers. Our bears are now in the CFMH ER to comfort children. What may be "just a charity quilt" to you, the maker, is a lovely thoughtful gift to the recipient. And when I look through the eyes of the coordinator, yes, they take my breath away. Blessed are the piecemakers.

At my very first quilt guild meeting I saw an effervescent woman with an English accent and wondered who she was. Now I know; it is Jackie Hodgson, our newsletter editor.

Jackie and Roy, her husband of 48 years, moved to Landfall Drive in Moneta in 2008 from Rochester New York, where she worked in healthcare as a registered nurse. Although she is a "Laker" now, part of her will always be in England among the thatched cottages and the British People. Jackie and her husband raised two girls, and now have two grandsons who love to spend a few weeks at the lake during the Summer.

Jackie has participated in several classes since joining the guild in 2008 and is an active member of the Shady Ladies Bee. So many of our members

enjoy 'Show and Tell' at the meetings and Jackie is no exception. It is her favorite part of guild meetings. She says, "I love to hear the stories behind the items that our members have so lovingly created."

Joining the guild was a natural step for Jackie as she has been quilting about twenty-five years. As an avid sewer of clothing and home décor, she was able to begin quilting by teaching herself.

I'm not sure she is a die-hard quilter, because she told me, "Jackie's Quilt Cave" is 'pristine' prior to a project. However, during the project ... not so much. Thread, notions, and cuttings tend to take over until the project is completed. Then her quilting studio returns to neatness.

Jackie has hand-quilted several quilts in the past, but her hands have requested she no longer do that. She owns an Elna, Janome and a serger. Small projects are machine quilted by her on the Elna, but larger items are taken to a professional machine quilter. If Jackie could learn one new quilting technique, it would definitely be machine quilting.

If you already know Jackie, you know that her favorite book is the Bible, and that she is a very giving individual. During COVID she has made almost 600 face coverings. She also sews items for 'Operation Christmas Child' shoeboxes, 'Sew Sisters' and several other charitable organizations as well as travelling to Uganda for evangelistic, medical missions.

When not helping others, Jackie loves to read, especially Joel Rosenburg's spy novels. Please do not ask her to help with gardening, as everything she touches will most likely die. She only cooks because eating is necessary; and exercises occasionally under pressure.

We were all so excited about finishing that special quilt for our quilt show in April. Although having never taken a class in the subject, Jackie had always wanted to try her hand at paper-piecing, so she bought a pattern that she thought would be easy. It wasn't. But despite being named 'The Elephant in the Room,' the completed quilt became the most talked about addition to her home. She was disappointed that she was unable to enter it in our quilt show earlier this year. Since she could not share it then, we will share it now.
