



Working the Quilt Show, whether it is for a 2-hour shift, half a day or an entire day or two is not only a fun time, but also a great bonding opportunity with your fellow guild members! Each member is expected to volunteer for at least one shift and there's sure to be a task you'd enjoy doing whether it's staffing the Welcome Table to greet our guests, White glove while walking around sharing our lovely quilts with our guests or assist in raising funds for the Guild's community projects by selling Boutique merchandise, or tickets for the Raffle quilt and baskets. And, of course who could resist the fun of setting up and taking down at the end of two busy days!

Sign Up sheets will be available at all Guild meetings. Sign up early and pick the shift you want.

Quilt Item Submissions for Lake Quilters Guild Members Only

The decision to limit our show participation to "guild members only" was made by the Board this week. This policy is a natural extension to our primary guiding principle that *Our Show* is to highlight our Guild. If we have friends who want to exhibit with us, please remind them that they have the option to join our Guild.

We have received 24 quilt submissions so far. Please remember to fill out *all the form fields*. That information is needed for sizing, and also to type the cards that will be displayed with each quilt. I have to admit that at each guild meeting over the last 18 months, I have enjoyed *show and tell* thinking "That will look great at *Our Show*!" Please send us your submissions earlier rather than later.

Submit Your Items!

How: A separate form and photo is required for each quilt or functional item. Forms and the category are posted on the website. We also supply printed copies at each Guild

When: All quilt entries are due by April 16th

Do you want to sell your quilt? For those of you who are considering sales, we've created a process to support you. Quilts that are for sale will be hung with all the other quilts. Therefore, you need to submit the registration form to Karen. On the form, there is a place to indicate the sales price of the quilt. We'll include that price on the wall tag located by your quilt. When someone wants to purchase the quilt, they will bring a picture of the quilt tag to the Boutique and we will ring up the sale at the Boutique register. The seller will receive 75% of the sales price and the guild will retain the 25% consignment fee. The quilt maker will receive notice on the day of the sale that their quilt sold. Payments from our Treasurer will happen within 30 days after the Show. The sold quilt cannot be removed until after *Our Show*. Future pick up arrangements will be made at the time of payment with the buyer and a Quilt Show representative.

DEFINITION OF CATEGORIES provided for your quick reference (also listed on the website):

Appliqué - appliqué work (hand, machine, computerized) must be predominant (at least 50%) over other techniques in amount and effect.

Modern – primarily functional quilts that emphasize and complement modern style. Common features of modern quilting may include bold piecing utilizing modern fabrics, high contrast and graphic areas, improvisational piecing, minimalism, maximalism, lack of borders, expansive negative space, modern traditionalism, and alternate grid work. Quilting often enhances the graphic nature of the quilt top with quilting designs used in different and unexpected ways.

Traditional - inspired by our quilting heritage focusing on excellence in construction and design using traditional quilt blocks.

Art Quilts – an original quilted design exploring a concept or idea, rather than a commercial pattern, and created for artistic display. Unusual techniques that are "outside the box" of traditional quilting may be incorporated; i.e., innovative application of dyes and paints, digital imagery, experimental textures and stitchery, and the use of various fibers ad embellishments. Design styles include abstract, portrait, landscape and themed images often originating from the artists' beliefs and emotions. Made and quilted by entrant.

Functional Quilted Items – quilted wearables (adorns the body), purses/totes, home décor such as pillows and table runners.

Miniature – must be a scaled down version of a full-sized quilt. No side larger than 24 inches and if blocks are used they may be no larger than four inches.

Treasurer's Report

Veronica was unable to be at the meeting, but sent her report. Available funds to LQG are \$11,209.53.

Operation Kid Comfort – Arlene Blackburn

- Thank you, Arlene, for organizing this successful event.
- All guilts have been delivered.
- Approximately 25 Guild members participated and about 20 people from outside guilds.
- Pre-cut kits really helped streamline the process and productivity.

Charity – Jan Emerick-Brothers

- There really needs to be a person manning the charity table at all meetings.

Quilt Show 2024 - Gail McCord

- Boutique is going well; Lyn Coleman has agreed to help with the Boutique.
- There is a lack of confidence in the pricing, but the committee has proposed a "pricing party", with a few people who have experience pricing these types of items.
- Cindy Holland is in charge of getting volunteers for the show there will be a big push to do this very soon.
- In addition to all the other events going on at the lake the weekend of the show, it is the 80th anniversary of D Day, and the show committee is hoping to draw some of those attendees to the show with signage and perhaps have a small display of patriotic quilts.
- All area Guilds have been notified of our show, and other advertising in the works.
- At the Joyous Junque sale, plans are to display quilts on each of the pay station tables with information about the show.
- At the A Day at the Lake event, the show committee is trying to coordinate with them to advertise our show.
- The donated guilts shown at last month's guild meeting will be raffled/auctioned off in 2025.
 - There will be a new category at this year's show: the Group quilt, which means The quilt show has created a new category called "Group" quilts. This category is defined as
 - o 2 or more sources / makers contributing to the quilt top
 - o A least one contributor of the top must be a Guild member
 - o Contributing sources could include purchased or handmade components from non-members
 - o The guilter does not have to be one of the top makers but could be a third party.
- Vendors there will probably not be the 6 we had hoped for, but that is okay. So far, we have Fork Mtn Quilting, a wallet maker, a jewelry booth, and possibly Tupperware.

Raffle Quilt Sales - Fran

- We have sold 1916 tickets as of 3/19/24, and have a net income of \$1271.49.
- We need more people to sign up for shifts at Kroger we've had some sign ups, but need to fill some time slots. Judy Edgeworth will contact each bee and ask them to get volunteers.
- Fran will make a bigger visual a chart showing where our needs are.

Membership

- Bev was unable to be here.
- There are 65 members renewed, including 7 businesses.
- Bev created the committee list for Fran. We will ask Bev to look over the membership forms and see if people expressed an interest in joining one of the committees.

Programs - Flo

- Nadine's purse workshop went well, and netted \$55 (\$5 per person).
- Mary Kerr workshop for April is cancelled but she will give the program at the Guild meeting on the 16th. She will stay with Joy.
- The programs in May and June are representatives from two charities that we support.
- June is also the show month.
- July's program will be Fellowship Day.

Job Descriptions – Joy

- After everyone has revised their job descriptions and send to Joy in digital format, she and Arlene will review.


CORE - Jan Emerick-Brothers

- Jan has collected \$60 from participants in this weekend's retreat at the Saunders Fire Hall. The rental of the space is \$150, so there will likely be a loss.
- Fall bus trip: Jan has contacted bus companies and has decided on one out of Lynchburg. The total bus cost will be \$2400 and the total VA Quilt Museum tour and behind the scenes tour is \$300. The trip will be on September 14th, a Saturday, and we would need a minimum of 34 people attending (there is a maximum of 54-56). Friends and others interested may also attend. There will be a stop on the way home at Patchwork Plus for some shopping. Money is due to the bus company 30 prior to departure date, no deposit required. We will need to charge approximately \$100 per person for the day. Fran made a motion to go ahead with this plan, and Arlene seconded, it passed unanimously.

Newsletter – Jan Brockman by phone

- There were formatting issues with February's and March's newsletters, and it was difficult to email it.
- We need a committee and a back-up for Jan, to address these issues and to make a plan for the newsletter.
- Jan will investigate the problem with a librarian from Moneta Library to see if she has any ideas and suggestions to fix the problem.
- Deadline this month for the newsletter is April 12.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:25pm. Our next board meeting is on May 7 at the Moneta library.
