### LQG BOARD MEETING MINUTES – November 5, 2024

Meeting was called to order at 1 pm.

President's Report – Joy

- Peaks and Pieces Guild has graciously invited our guild to a lecture on curved piecing on November 12.
- Report on the Water Authority:
- We are confirmed through February 2025, although our January meeting will be at held at the Moneta library.
- We are waiting to hear about availability through the rest of 2025.
- Arlene proposed that the guild participate in a zoom quilter's seminar weekend (May 3-4, 2025, for \$100
- for all of guild). Each member will get a code that they can take the classes from 18 instructors for the weekend.
   Classes are available for 72 hours afterwards.

### Program: Using Technology to Open Up Our Quilting World

To get us started, the Program Committee already has a 2-Day program scheduled over an entire weekend in May to use these skills.
