LQG Bus Trip

Several guild members have shown interest in a bus trip to Mary Jo's Fabric Store in Gastonia, NC. For those who have never been there, Mary Jo's sells all kinds of fabric sewing supplies at discount prices. They have a very large quilting department. The trip would also include a stop at a thread outlet nearby. The price of the trip would depend on the number of individuals who sign up. If we get 30 people, the price would be about \$45. The more we have going, the cheaper the price. If the bus is filled with 55 participants, it would cost about \$24. So please think about the trip. It will be a fun filled day of shopping!! At the February meeting I will pass around a paper so that those who are interested can add their names. This will give us an idea of how many would like to go. The trip possibly would be in the early fall.

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up.

Raise the Roof
By Tonee White

(In fond memory of Joan Bjorkfelt, president of the Lake Quilters Guild 1999-2000)

Are you looking for a change? Have you been thinking about making a quilt that's slightly off the beaten path? Have you been considering making a picture quilt? Then Raise the Roof is the answer to what you've been looking for. Raise the Roof is a culmination of 10 years of designing and constructing quilts by Tonee White. In it she takes you to the countryside alongside "Old Homesteads" (old log cabins), to the shore with "Beacons of Light" (light houses), and out to the farm with "Barn Raising", along with three other equally backroad "getaway" projects.

White's projects combine traditional piecing and appliqué techniques. Included with the book is a packet containing full-sized patterns for each of the projects, and the book itself provides comprehensive instructions. All of the quilts in White's book are endearing, but I have to say my favorite is "Tattersall Lane" (page 58). It is a warm and inviting, folk-art style house which makes you feel like walking up to the front porch, knocking on the door, and hoping those inside will invite you in for coffee and cookies. Luckily, it is also the one project in the book I would consider the easiest for beginners to attempt before moving on to the other projects.

So...looking for something a little different to do? Looking to get away from your quilting rut and the mayhem of making lots of traditional blocks to make a quilt? Then take a trip off the beaten path and look into Raise the Roof. (And when you get to the house at "Tattersall Lane", if they invite you in for cookies, tell them I sent you!)

NOTE: We have looked into insurance on the quilts in the show, and since the quilts are all owned by members, insurance is not available through our current policy. Individual homeowner's policies DO provide insurance for members. If something is particularly valuable, individuals should have special riders on their own insurance.

NOTE: Ladies! Don't forget about our Quilt Show's "Old Fashioned Quilting Bee". We need ladies to cut and piece. We also need hand quilters as well as machine quilters. Where else can you go for two days and do nothing but eat, talk and sew! We need 6 inch squares of your brightly colored scraps and crib size batting about 40" by 52". Now pull out those stash fabrics that you know you are never going to use and donate a yard for backing for our charity quilts. What better way to clean out your sewing room! Can't you just see a child's face light up when they receive one of these brightly colored quilts.

Please let Mary Johnson or Joyce Moorman know what you are donating so we can be sure we have enough supplies on hand to keep us busy for two days of eating, talking, sewing and quilting. Beginner Bee Forming

(Could it be called the Newbee??)

Through your membership form survey questions and general conversation, we read and heard that some of you would like a beginner basics bee with a mentor. At the request of Sharon Pafford, Marcia Wright and I began to develop a series of sessions to address some basic skills. Starting with the February Guild meeting, we will meet at 11 am for about ninety minutes. If all goes well we will meet each month on Guild day at 11 am. Here is a small sampling of what we will attempt to cover. Session one will address fabric selection, quilter's tools, cutting accurately and hand quilting. We will all practice cutting with a rotary cutter. The homework will be to cut accurate strips for a log cabin block. In March, we will discuss and demonstrate the infamous 1/4" seam allowance. Other items under discussion will be such things as stitch length, strip piecing, chain sewing, pinning, pressing and much more. Homework will be to accurately sew the log cabin block. By the end of six months, we hope to complete four blocks into a wall hanging or table runner size, complete with sashing, borders and quilting (hand or machine). We will be using Alex Anderson's book Start Quilting, which I will be happy to order for anyone who would like a copy. Mary Johnson and Linda Pote have offered to assist us with this program so there will be plenty of "personal" attention available. If this sounds good to you or if you have questions, call or email Marcia or me or nab us at the February meeting. Bring your rotary cutter, mat, ruler and some scrap fabric.

Featured Quilter of the Month

I grew up and lived in Floyd County and attended Check High School. The first time I saw quilting was when my mother would go to the church and help others quilt for neighbors.

Mama started making quilts for our home. I watched her.

I took Home Economics in school, so I learned to make my own clothes. I worked for a few years, met my husband and got married. I decided to go to beauty school and had a beauty shop in my home for about 18-20 years. Many women would bring their quilt pieces and work on them while drying their hair. One day a woman was making a quilt that caught my eye that was called The Cathedral Window. I asked her for the pattern. I went home, found some material, cut the pattern and made one square. I decided I would not make this quilt as it was too hard and would take too long. But I couldn't get it out of my mind. So, the next time I was in the material shop I bought enough fabric to make the quilt. That was my first quilt.

We moved to Salem and my family did not want me to move the beauty shop. I went to work for Krogers and worked for 23 years. I was still interested in quilting. Carolyn, my middle daughter, wanted a Double Wedding Ring Quilt. She bought the material and asked me to make it. I did not cut it right and when I started putting it together, it did not work. I had to remake some pieces. Then we moved to the lake and I joined the Quilt guild and went to a Bee. I have learned a lot through the guild and bee. I made a quilt for two more of my daughters and still have two more daughters that I need to make a quilt for. Sure hope I get better by then. I have made a total of 8 large quilts and 4 baby or twin quilts for my grandchildren. My husband has claimed the quilt I put in the Ferrum Quilt Show. I found the pattern, Fire Works, in the Quilters Newsletter Magazine. It was quilted by Ann Whalen.

Quilting is my passion. Through the Quilt Guild I have been able to improve my love for quilting and have made so many wonderful lifelong Friends.

2006 LQG QUILT CHALLENGE

2006 Challenge...There's a song on my quilt.

We want LOTS of people taking on this challenge. It will get your creative juices going. If you don't think you have creative juices, you're wrong. You just haven't unleashed them yet. Once you get going, the ideas will come pouring out so fast, you won't be able to stop them.

All you have to do is listen to a song, any song, and then make a quilt that illustrates the title of that song. It can be any interpretation that you want. It does not have to follow the lyrics of the song. It can be literal, humorous, or a play on words. Have fun with it.

You can use any form of quilt making that you want, piecing, appliqué, redwork, wool...anything. The size of the quilt needs to be at least 1/4 yard to a max of queen size. This challenge is due in December and you may not show the quilt before that. Any quilts shown before December will not be eligible for prizes! Yes! Prizes! We will award prizes to the best representation of a song title along with the funniest representation as voted by viewers. We will also have a contest to see who can match up the most quilts with their song titles. I will be collecting the song titles (and hopefully the artists' names too) in October and November so I can compile the list for the December meeting.

Now, get going. Don't wait to do this. All the songs you hear will haunt you until this challenge is done!

And our supply of bears and quilts is depleted after the Christmas holidays. In January our last bears were distributed as follows:

- 4 bears to Lynchburg CASA
- 11 bears to Franklin County Social Services

Please come and sew...and have a good time too. Thanks to Geri Grindle, we'll have lots and lots of stuffing for our bears. So, if you've taken a new bear pattern or would prefer to use our old bear pattern (that's okay too!) please cut out a few at home. You can sew a couple so they are ready for stuffing right away...and then sew the rest when you get to Trinity.

And if you have an idea for a <u>quick</u> quilt, please bring the materials to make it and work on it during the charity quilt-in...so we can all see if it's something we'd like to try ourselves the next time. We'll also have a couple of panels with batting and backing that will be in need of some machine quilting if anyone is interested!

We need you to bring:

- -sewing machines and sewing supplies
- -fabrics for bears and quilts (some have been donated)
- -bears sewn and ready to stuff!!!
- -knitting needles or implements for stuffing bears
- -good scissors for clipping around edges of new bears
- -thread to match your fabric for topstitching bears
- -your lunch and a beverage

It'll be fun to see what everyone is working on! Thanks in advance for all your efforts. It should put a smile on your face to know you'll be spreading some joy when someone hugs a bear you made or is kept warm by a quilt you've made!!


