

Book Review: by Tina Dietz

Quilts from the Heart (by Karin Renaud)

Are you a beginner quilter looking for some easy but fun projects to make? Are you a seasoned quilter looking for some quick ways to use up some scraps? Do scrappy quilts warm your heart? Then it's time to pick up <u>Quilts from the Heart</u> by Karin Renaud. But first let me tell you about the inspiration for Renaud's book...it will leave you feeling warm all over.

In 2001 Renaud read about Project Linus, the organization that delivers quilts to children going through difficulties which are often times far beyond our comprehension. She was so touched by the stories and letters of those involved with and affected by the project that she began making quilts for Project Linus herself. In three years she made and donated 30 quilts! Because Renaud's love of the history behind quiltmaking is as strong as her motivation for making the quilts to give away, Quilts from the Heart is a compilation of twenty projects based on traditional quilt patterns, but using the more contemporary bright and fun fabrics children love. Once you see the explosion of cheerful colors Renaud uses you will easily be able to imagine the smiles they bring to their new owners' faces! Renaud's directions for the projects are clear and straightforward, and most of the quilts are made up of squares, rectangles, and half-square triangles. (No set in corners!) The projects are kept simple so that you, too, might be inclined to make a few to give away to children in need of smiles. As Renaud says, making quilts to donate not only leaves you with a warm feeling, but it may also provide you with an opportunity to use colors you might not ordinarily use for a project for yourself or your own family, or that wouldn't fit with your home's color scheme. As well, it offers you the chance to experiment with different blocks, block layouts, and even quilting techniques, on a small scale ,before you tackle a larger project using those elements.

<u>Sweatshirt Jacket Workshop by Sandra Ferguson</u>

We're planning to have a sweatshirt jacket workshop in October, taught by Sandra Ferguson and Joyce Noell. For those planning to take the workshop, we thought you might like to have a supplies list now so you could be looking for your supplies.

Sweatshirts are hard to find in the summer months. We suggest trying <u>Cheap-esTees.com</u> on line. They have a Jerzees 50/50 crewneck sweatshirt in 23 colors available for about \$8 plus shipping. Several people might like to go together and order, which will save shipping costs.

You will need a sweatshirt at least 2 sizes larger than what you'd normally wear. A size 12 person needs a man's large (42-44). A size 14-16 person needs a man's extra large (46-48). It should be washed in warm water and dried in the dryer before the workshop.

Other items you'll need are:

*an assortment of coordinating fabric scraps

*2-3 large pieces of fabric, coordinating with the scraps, 1/4 to 1/2 yard cut, full width *sewing machine with decorative stitches, assorted feet for embroidery, and 2-3

bobbins filled with the thread that matches your shirt

*pins

*scissors

*sewing thread to match your shirt

*embroidery threads to go with the fabric

During the summer, we will be showing examples of shirts with a number of options. You can even make a vest, if you'd prefer. The method is the same. We even have one that uses "cheater" quilt fabric (not pre-quilted). Another option uses grosgrain ribbon between strips of fabric on the shirt, and takes about 20-25 yards of ribbon. We've also found a source of bulk ribbon that is decent quality, available in 100 foot rolls from <u>Papermart.com</u>. Even with the shipping, it's cheaper than buying at a fabric store, and you'll have a lot left over to share or use for other projects. You need 5/8" wide ribbon.

We'll keep you posted on the workshop. Look for examples on display during the summer, and start collecting your supplies. The cost of the workshop is \$10. It will be October 24 from 9-12.

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
