MACHINE QUILTING WORKSHOP

Rose-Marie Newcomb

SUPPLIES:

2 yards muslin

1 yard batting: can be any kind, such as Warm & Natural, Hobbs Heirloom, polyester, etc.

Thread to match fabric

Fine Sharpie marker, any color as long as you can see it on white

Sewing machine in good working order with your accessories, foot pedal (don't laugh), cord

Scissors, safety pins, rotary cutter, mat and ruler

(Note from Rose-Marie: This is a techniques class. Patterns will be provided by me. Also very important: a sense of humor. This is not rocket science. We have no quilt police here. We will be having fun, as quilting should be.)

Rose-Marie will follow during our program time with the latest materials and aids from Sulky. This will be highlighted by a display of her quilts using the techniques and materials.

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop.

- * Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time.....Please don't ask us to break this rule.
 Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.

Charity Projects

We still need 50 Christmas stockings...for Step, Inc. of Franklin County. We received 30 at the October guild meeting (*thank you...they're beautiful*)...we need a total of 80 this year! We need to deliver these stockings the first week in December. Remember that the stockings <u>do not</u> need to be filled this <u>year</u>...the teachers will fill the stockings themselves since they know the childrens' needs better than we do. So, please get out your Christmas scraps and start making stockings about 15" in length.

Attention "Oueen Bees"...we'd really like the help of the Bees for putting all the material that Sonny Capps (Irene's husband) brought us to good use for our charity projects...so they're ready for the February Charity Ouilt-In. We have fabric bolts for bears and have rubber banded some coordinating bolts together for guilts (along with an easy guilt pattern...but you can also use your own pattern). There will be two different patterns, (1) the rail fence with three bolts of fabric rubber banded together and (2) the checkerboard with two bolts of fabric rubber banded together. Each of the "quilt" fabric stacks also have backs cut from wider fabrics so there will be no need to piece the back! These fabric bolts will be on a table at the November meeting with a sign Attention "Queen Bee". There is enough for each Bee to pick out one color for bears and one rubberbanded stack for guilts. Also be sure to pick up a pack of hearts to sew on the bears. Donated by LOG labels to sew in the seam and guilt labels for the back of the quilts. It would be wonderful if the Bees could cut out bears, sew on hearts, sew the seams together with a "Donated by LOG" label in the seam and possibly snip the seams (except for the back where they'll be hand sewn together) and have them ready for stuffing at the February Charity Quilt-In. If we get snowed in in January ... the Bees will have some projects ready to be cut or sewn! The guilt tops could be cut and machine pieced and brought to the Ouilt-In to be machine quilted by someone...if you didn't want to quilt them yourselves. We'd really appreciate your help, so we can really get a lot done at the 2007 Ouilt-In. If the "Oueen Bee" can't be at the November meeting, please designate an alternate to pick the material up for you...and IF you pick it up before the regular meeting starts, we'll help you take it to your car!

Thanks for all your efforts on the charity projects... they really are appreciated by the community!
