

The frost is on the pumpkin and we're all ready for the whirlwind that is fall. So many things to do and so many projects to complete; Quilt in a Year, the musical challenge, a quilt or quilts for the Blue Ridge Festival and all those workshop pieces that got started and somehow have become UFO's.

Our thanks to **Lois Griffith** for her enlightening program on design. Here are a list of the design books she suggested; *Artist's Way* by Julia Cameron, *The Visual Dance* by Joen Wolfram, *The Magical Effects of Color* by Joen Wolfram, *Patchwork Persuasion* by Joen Wolfram, *Color and Cloth* by Mary Coyne Penders, *Nature's Studio* by Joan Colvin, *Blended Quilts* by Marsha McClosky & Sharon Yenter, and *Blended Quilts from the Beginning* by Sharon Yenter.

Our **October** workshop is the long awaited sweatshirt workshop, taught by **Sandra Ferguson** and **Joyce Noell**. The workshop is from 9 AM to 12 PM and the supplies list follows.

SUPPLY LIST

Sweatshirt two or more sizes larger than you normally wear. Wash in warm water and dry in the dryer before the workshop.

- * 2 3 large pieces of fabric $-\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ yard full width cuts
- * An assortment of coordinating fabric scraps
- * Sewing machine with decorative stitches, assorted embroidery feet, and 2 3 bobbins filled with the thread that matches your sweatshirt
- * Pins
- * Scissors
- * Sewing thread to match your sweatshirt
- * Embroidery threads to go with your fabric
- * A zipper or cording foot for your machine if you have one. (May be used in one technique for stabilizing the shirt.)
- * 20 25 yards of grosgrain ribbon 5/8 inch wide (optional)

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop.

- * Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will NOT be taking phone sign-ups before this time.....Please don't ask us to break this rule.
 Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- * Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.

BOOK REVIEW: by Tina Dietz

(Note: This book has lots of quick-to-make Christmas gift ideas!)

A Passion for Patchwork (By Lise Bergene)

Whether you have been looking to start a small project or a more massively-sized one, and whether you like traditional quilting or go for the more contemporary styles, with "over 100 quilted projects for all seasons", chances are excellent that you will find exactly what you are looking for in the latest edition to our guild library: <u>A Passion for Patchwork</u>, by Lise Bergene. This is a book that definitely has something for everyone, and LOADS of quick-to-whip-up gift ideas just in time for those of you who are starting to think of Christmas!

In the smaller project category, there are aprons, unique tote and gift bags of every size (and nearly every shape), table runners, placemats, pillows and even potholders. For medium-sized projects there are plenty of wallhangings, including an adorable Advent Calendar using hearts (see page 105), tablecloths, and a few very sweet doll blankets. Under larger projects there are several full-size quilts, and lap-size quilts if you are looking for something not as large. Within each of these categories there are plenty of projects for machine appliqué, raggedy-edge quilting, or traditional machine piecing. Likewise, if you love scrappy quilt projects or just have lots of scraps you want to use up, <u>A Passion for Patchwork</u> will provide you with lots of ideas, including ways to use up the denim from those cut-up jeans most of us have stashed in our stashes.

Most of Bergene's projects will be easy enough for an experienced beginner (those of you who have completed a quilt or two), and will provide even the experienced quilters with lots of chances to experiment and just have fun. And true to its claim, the book does have projects for all seasons. (This is my way of leading in to mention *my* favorite project in the book: "Bite of Autumn Throw", page 96. While it looks complicated to make, once you glance at the

E-mail Issue of The Lake Tidings Available


